Dear Friends,

The next parish Holy Hour takes place 7 PM on Tuesday, February 23, the Commemoration of Saint Polycarp. The Holy Hour consists of praying the Rosary followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Evening Prayer, and Benediction. All are invited.

Stations of the Cross will be prayed this Friday evening at 7 PM.

I wrote a couple of weeks ago of the 13th annual Man Up Philly Men's Spirituality Conference where men from across the archdiocese gather for an inspiring day of faith and fellowship. This year the conference will be Zoomed virtually and the schedule shortened due to the ongoing pandemic. Although Confessions, Eucharistic Adoration, and Mass will not be part of the conference as they were in previous years, the conference will feature four inspiring speakers. Scheduled to give presentations are Most Reverend Joseph Coffey, Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Military Services and a former priest of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia; Reverend Mike Schmitz, Director of Ministries for Youth and Young Adults in the Diocese of Duluth, Minnesota and also known as a speaker, author and a presence on the Internet and YouTube; Deacon Steve Javie of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, former referee with the National Basketball Association and nephew of the late Monsignor Anthony Jaworoski, who at one time resided at Sacred Heart; and Retired Colonel Tom Manion, USMC, founder of the Travis Manion Foundation which supports our military and families of the fallen. The Conference is taking place on Saturday, March 6. For more information and to register go to the website: www.manupphilly.com.

Most Reverend Michael Fitzgerald, Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia will be here to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation during the 10:15 AM Mass on Sunday, March 7. Because the limited seating capacity in the church due to the pandemic will become even more restricted, it is suggested for people who usually attend the 10:15 AM Mass on Sundays to come to the 8 AM Mass on that day.

Thank you for your goodness in two recent second collections. The Snow Removal collection was \$832 and the collection for the aging and ill priests of the archdiocese came to \$941.

Today's parish bulletin contains the report of ordinary parish income and expenses for the first three and six months of the current fiscal year that ends June 30, 2021. The report for the first six months of Fiscal Year 2020 is also given to show the effect the coronavirus is having on our parish financially. The parish went from an operating surplus of \$8,476 for the first six months of Fiscal Year 2020 to an operating loss of \$20,472 for the first six months of Fiscal Year 2021, a negative swing of nearly \$29,000. Ordinary parish expenses have been reduced by nearly \$37,400. However, ordinary parish income has dropped by over \$66,000. Please note that Sunday collections were down an average of \$885 a week from the previous year. (Interest and Rentals, Net were a combined line item last fiscal year; they are now separate.) Thank you for all you do to contribute to the support of the parish.

Everyone 14 years of age and older are reminded that, as a minimal obligation in doing penance during Lent, they are to refrain for eating meat on the Fridays of Lent.
