

On Dec. 8, 1991, a priest was celebrating Mass in the chapel of the Marian Shrine of Betania in Venezuela when, during the Consecration, he saw the Host begin to bleed. This miraculous Host is preserved at the convent of the Augustinian Recollect Nuns of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, where it is permanently exposed for adoration of the faithful and visited by numerous pilgrims each year. Many prodigious events have taken place here, most notably the one that occurred when a young American filmed the miraculous Host pulsating like a heart. Scientific examination of the Host has revealed that the Blood matches the type found on the Shroud of Turin. This is just one of the many approved Eucharistic Miracles that have taken place around the world through the centuries. Blessed Carlo Acutis, who died at the age of 15 and whose Cause of Beatification is underway, compiled a photographic exhibit of over a hundred of these miracles. We invite you to view this display on Saturday, December 3rd at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, 502 Ford St., Bridgeport, PA. Our Eucharistic Day will begin with a 9:00 a.m. sung Mass. From 10:00 - 2:00, there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in church while the **Eucharistic Miracles display will be** open to the public in the hall. The day will conclude with Benediction at 2:00 p.m. and homily by Fr. Peter DiMaria, pastor of Sacred Heart parish. Drop in for a while or spend the day! 

NOVEMBER 20, 2022 - OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

It was designed to be regal, and so it was. It was meant to honor a much-loved royal person, for indeed she was: Elizabeth II, queen of England and all the realm. The funeral of a woman who from girlhood kept all of her significant vows: to be a devoted wife and mother, and to put service of



God and country first. Whatever residual hesitation we may have as Americans of royalty, we had to admire the love of millions of her subjects for their queen that prompted their tears, and the unspoken demand that they line the streets and queue up to visit her coffin. We were in awe of the pomp and ceremony that the British do so well for her funeral rites.

This November day, with the memories of that late summer event of 2022 already fading, the Church asks us to turn our attention today to Our Lord Jesus Christ, "The King of the Universe," the God-Man who had no regal funeral by any measure. The Crowds did line the streets of Jerusalem, mostly to mock Him. Nor did He leave behind a tomb of bones for veneration because His Sacred Body lay dead only until early in the morning of the long predicted "Third Day."

We know Our Lord's earthly origin was not royal, but only if you forget momentarily about the queenly womb in which He was ensconced for 9 months. He was born in a stable, of all places, with all the isolation and the smells of one. He was laid with simple wrappings onto rough straw in a manger where speechless animals came for food. Even His crib was made of rough hewn wood, presaging that of a Roman cross as His deathbed.

In between, there were miraculous moments of incomparable beauty, as when He enabled the blind to see and the lame to walk. He fed thousands of His stranded followers out of unlikely portions of bread and fish. Those topped off by the occasions when He raised the dead to life so that they could breathe the air of their special homeland all over again.

All that was not enough to deflect His enemies from their chosen course. Love can be blind in a romantic context. But they, the Scribes and Pharisees, and also their ignorant and prejudiced followers, showed us the blindness of hate fostered by jealousy. True, Jesus' harshest words were aimed at their hard hearts, well hidden under plush robes. But He could do no less as the very personification of Truth and Justice.

And so He had to die. And die He did, in the cruelest imaginable way, designed by the Roman mind and then executed by its officials and their soldiers. Christ's only guards at His tomb were paid and oblivious soldiers bored to death with their task of preventing fanaticism.

But we know Jesus our King lives! Because of Him, we have the chance to live forever in truly regal splendor. Talk about a reason for gratitude this day, a mere four days out from our national Thanksgiving Day. How masterfully did Handel the musician put praise of Christ to music: "King of kings! Lord of lords! Forever and ever! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!"


