Prayer for Healing

Dear Lord, We lift up all those who are facing illness today.

We ask that You would bring Healing, Comfort, & Peace to their bodies.

Faith Formation

In *Fratelli Tutti* ("Brothers All"), Pope Francis teaches us that the divine command to love one another transcends boundaries and distances and invites all to put that teaching into action. The summary of the encyclical continues.

The third chapter, Envisaging and Engendering an Open World, has Francis telling us that mature and authentic love and true friendship is only possible when it takes root in hearts open to growth through relationship with others. This means going beyond one's own inner circle of comfort, including one's own region or nation. He calls this "social friendship," a love capable of transcending borders, one that makes possible true universal openness.

He contrasts this by noting the presence of social groups continually being formed that wish to cling to an identity that separates themselves from others. These groups do not look to others as "neighbors," personified in the person of the Good Samaritan. Rather, they look to "associates" to partner with them on common interests. All this does is create and advance an individualism that stymies true freedom, equality, and fraternity. "Associates" are capable of only creating closed worlds.

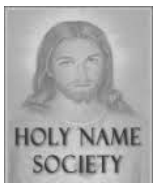
Francis reaffirms traditional church social teaching by saying social friendship and universal fraternity calls for worldwide acknowledgement of the worth of every human person. No country (or individual or people) has the right to deny this right, even to those who are deemed unproductive, were born with developed limitations, or do not fit into a particular worldview or purpose.

He then goes on to define the word "solidarity." Solidarity means:

- thinking and acting in terms of community;
- giving priority to the life of every person over the appropriation of goods by a few;
- working to overcome the structural causes of poverty, inequality, the lack of employment, land, and housing, and the denial of social and labor rights;
- confronting what he calls the "destructive effects of the empire of money."

One of the final paragraphs of Envisaging and Engendering an Open World contains this statement which Francis employs philosophical logic and should cause the reader to reflect on its message. "If every human being possesses an inalienable dignity, if all people are my brothers and sisters, and if the world truly belongs to everyone, then it matters little whether my neighbor was born in my country or elsewhere."
