Dear Friends,

Looking ahead to next week, February 17 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. It is understandable that today's situation with the coronavirus may lead some to have second thoughts about having ashes imposed on their foreheads. The archdiocesan Office for Divine Worship has informed parishes they may implement the method for the distribution of ashes commonly used in Europe. Ashes may be sprinkled on the top of a person's head rather than be imposed on the forehead. This avoids any physical contact between the minister and the one receiving the ashes. The distribution of ashes will occur during the 8 AM Mass as well as during liturgical services beginning at 12:15 PM and 7 PM.

Today's bulletin has a listing of spiritual activities, devotional prayer services, and extra times for the Sacrament of Penance (Confessions) during Lent. Next Sunday's bulletin will list the traditional rules for fast and abstinence.

The next parish Holy Hour will begin at 7 PM on Tuesday, February 23, the Commemoration of Saint Polycarp. The Holy Hour consists of praying the Rosary followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Evening Prayer, and Benediction. All are invited.

The 2021 Catholic Charities Appeal has begun. Money raised is directed to Catholic Social Services (including Nutritional Development Services), Catholic Special Education, Skilled Care for Retired and Sick Priests, Mission Parishes, the Office for Life and Family, Cultural Ministries, and Foundation Activities. All donated funds are deposited into a separate 501 (c) (3) account. Although our registered parishioners received a general mailing from Catholic Charities, extra forms and envelopes for the Appeal are available in the church narthex. By way of reminder, **all checks are to be made payable to Catholic Charities Appeal and sent directly to the Appeal in the self-addressed envelope.** Donations to Catholic Charities are not to be sent to the rectory. Plans for the 13th Man Up Philly Men's Spirituality Conference are underway. This annual event brings together men from across the archdiocese for an inspiring day of faith and fellowship. Due to social distancing guidelines, planners are evaluating the best manner to hold the Conference. Presenters this year include Bishop Joseph Coffey and Colonel Tom Manion. Bishop Coffey was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and has been an active chaplain with the U.S. Navy for many years. Bishop Coffey is Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Military Services. Colonel Manion served in the United States Marine Corps for over 30 years. He is founder of the Travis Manion Foundation, named after his son, First Lieutenant Travis Manion, USMC, who in April 2007 gave his life for our nation. The Foundation supports our military, the families of the fallen, and helps to create the next generation of leaders. Irish tenor Mark Forrest will return to lead the singing at the Eucharistic Adoration. The Conference will conclude with Mass (not the Sunday vigil Mass) celebrated by Archbishop Pérez. The Conference's mission is to invite women to a personal and transformative encounter with Jesus, as well as to equip women to live their gifts in service to the family, the Church, and all aspects of society. The Conference is planned for Saturday, October 23, 2021 from 9 AM to 4:30 PM at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa, 534 Ferry Road, Doylestown, PA.
