Parents attendance at our Parish's Pre-Jordan program should be satisfied before a Baptism date is set. Parents are asked not to make any celebratory arrangements until a Baptism date is confirmed by our Rectory staff.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Please speak to Father Nasta at least six months before your anticipated Wedding date.
Couples should not make any celebratory arrangements until after they have met with Father at our Parish.

The Sacrament of The Sick

Please speak to Father Nasta if you or a family member wish to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

It is always appropriate to receive this Sacrament before surgery, during a serious illness or in the final stages of life.

Dear Friends,

Today is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This feast presents an opportunity to remind everyone of the requirements for a person to be eligible to act as a sponsor (godparent) at either Baptism or Confirmation. The requirements are listed elsewhere in today's bulletin.

Poinsettias that were used to decorate the sanctuary for Christmas are available to be taken home after Mass this weekend. Flowers and other decorations placed on gravesites for the Christmas holiday at St. Augustine Catholic Cemetery will be removed beginning the week of January 17.

Archbishop Pérez granted special permission for parishes to schedule a Christmas Eve Mass as early as 2 PM along with having more Masses than usual to help deal with potential overcrowding. This why our parish had 5 Masses on Christmas Eve. Our 2 PM on Christmas Eve had the highest attendance at 87; the 4 PM had 41 people. Combined attendance at the other 3 Masses on Christmas Eve was less than the attendance at the 2 PM Mass (8 PM – 27, 10 PM – 26, 12 AM – 19). There were 25 people at the 8 AM on Christmas Day and 56 at the 10:15 AM Mass. The same schedule will not be in place for Christmas 2021.

Statements are available only to registered members of the parish (those who receive and use their parish envelopes) and should be available by January 31.

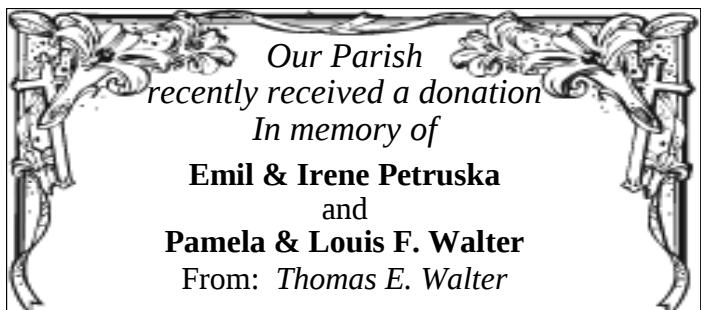

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord presents an opportunity to offer as a reminder the following requirements for a person to be able to act as a sponsor (godparent) at Baptism.

1. *Only one sponsor is required at a Baptism, although it is customary to have two. No more than two sponsors are permitted and they are not to be of the same sex.*
2. A sponsor is to be at least 16 years of age and is to have received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.
3. A sponsor is to be a living witness of his/her Catholic faith. This means he/she attends Mass on the weekend and receives the sacraments on a regular basis. It also means that if married, he/she was married according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
4. *A non-practicing Catholic may be admitted as a sponsor only if the pastor or minister of the sacrament can determine that the person is in the process of returning to the regular practice of the faith.*
5. *A person baptized in another Christian community can act as a Christian witness at a Baptism, but only together with a Catholic sponsor.*
6. A Catholic who has not been confirmed or received Holy Eucharist, has abandoned the Catholic Church by formally joining a non-Catholic faith community, was married outside the Catholic Church (without proper dispensation), or is living in a relationship that simulates marriage (cohabitation or domestic partnership) may not be a sponsor.
7. *Neither a person who has left the Catholic Church by enrollment in a non-Catholic faith community nor an unbaptized person may serve as a Christian witness at a Baptism.*

A Catholic asked to be a sponsor at a Baptism (or Confirmation) taking place in another church is normally required to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from the parish in which he/she currently resides and is registered. The Certificate attests to the fact that the one asked to be a sponsor is a Catholic who practices his/her faith. The Certificate should be obtained as soon as one is asked to be a sponsor and presented to the church where the Baptism is taking place well in advance of the date for the Baptism.

The eligibility requirements that are underlined also apply to a person who is asked to be a sponsor at Confirmation.
