Dear Friends,

Flowers and other Christmas decorations placed on gravesites at Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery will be removed beginning this week.

Statements are available only to registered members of the parish (those who receive and use their parish envelopes) and should be available by January 31.

Both the Parish Office and the Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery Office will be closed Monday, January 18, for the national holiday honoring Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

The parish Holy Hour this month is Friday, January 22, the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn. The Holy Hour begins at 7 PM and consists of praying of the Rosary, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Evening Prayer, and Benediction. All are invited to attend.

The next day, Saturday, January 23, the Archdiocesan Office for Life and Family and the Pro-Life Union of Greater Philadelphia are among the organizations sponsoring the Philadelphia March for Life. The event includes a 9 AM Mass celebrated by Archbishop Pérez at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, followed by a march to the Philadelphia Women's Center at 777 Appletree Street. The day concludes with a rally at Independence Mass from 12 PM to 1 PM. Facemasks and social distancing are required at all times. There is free and paid parking at the Cathedral and paid parking in the vicinity of Independence Mall. For more details, please go to [prolifeunion.org](http://prolifeunion.org).

A number of weekday Masses from March until June remain available for specific intentions. Requests for unannounced Mass intentions, those offered on an unspecified day and/or location, are also being accepted. It is preferred that all requests for Mass intentions, both announced and unannounced, be made in person at the parish office during regular business hours. A donation of \$10 per Mass is requested.

Just as a reminder, In the event inclement weather causes Upper Merion Area School District to either delay the start of the school day or close the schools, morning Mass will be cancelled and the intentions for those Masses will be transferred to the next available day. The safety of everyone, particularly our seniors who attend Mass regularly on weekdays, is paramount.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 30% discount on any new pre-purchase of a crypt in Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the cemetery office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. This offer is good throughout 2021.

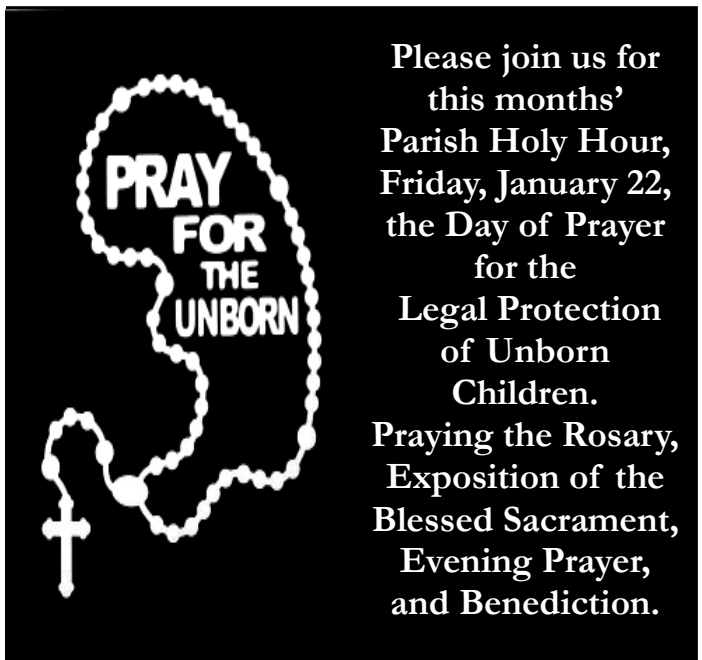

## *Faith Formation*

Happy New Year! May God bestow his blessings, protection, and peace upon us all throughout 2021.

January 6 this year was the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of an encyclical by Pope Pius XII titled *Quemadmodum*. Encyclicals are named after the first word or words from the Latin text. *Quemadmodum* is an adverb meaning simply “Just as,” or “While”. One must go to the third sentence to discover its theme -- the plight of countless children living in destitution all over the globe in the aftermath of the Second World War, which had concluded four months earlier.

Pius implores the world’s bishops to do more than what was already being done by other individuals, organizations, and societies in coming to the aid of these children. He points out their sufferings. They lack proper food, clothing, and shelter. They suffer from cold, hunger, and disease. They do not know what it is or means to be loved.

The Holy Father asks for bishops to assign a day of prayer within their dioceses for this cause and, in union with their priests, to have this on the forefront of the minds of the faithful.

Since the children of today grow up to be what Pius calls the “pillars of the next generation,” he insists upon the necessity of transforming children living a life of destitution to becoming children with healthy minds and bodies. This will help “to avoid a race infected with sickness and vice.” Just as the faith community in Apostolic times offered their prayers and shared their material goods with those most in need, Pius calls upon the peoples of his day to do likewise. Those who do so imitate the words and actions of the Lord Jesus, who invited the children to come to him unimpeded.

Pius commends all who carry out the works of justice and mercy towards children – everyone from religious communities and faith-based organizations to secular efforts in both the civilized and uncivilized world. Special mention is given to the Pontifical Society of the Holy Childhood.

He concludes *Quemadmodum* by stating his purpose for writing it. Children who grow up deprived of the basic necessities of life are an easy prey for the snares of vice, sloth, and delinquency. Those who grow up with those necessities are attracted to a virtuous life, one which leads to becoming a productive contributor to family life and the common good.
