Dear Friends,

Today is the Sunday of the Word of God. Please go to the Faith Formation section of today's bulletin for a summary I prepared of Pope Francis' apostolic letter that instituted this observance.

Thank you for your donations in the second collections the last two weekends. The Church Heating Fund received \$727 and \$685 was collected for Catholic Relief Services.

The 2021 Catholic Charities Appeal begins next Sunday. More information about the Appeal will be in next weekend's bulletin, including the final report of our parishioner's contributions to the 2020 Catholic Charities Appeal.

By way of reminder, it is strongly suggested and highly recommended that people who are at high risk from catching COVID-19 to remain at home. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on the weekend granted by Archbishop Pérez remains in effect. Everyone is to wear a mask while in church, except for liturgical ministers in the performance of their ministry. All are encouraged to socially distance themselves by sitting towards the end of an available pew. People are asked not to sit in those pews separated by the red markers, which are there to ensure the proper 6-foot distancing between those sitting at the ends of the pews. Those who live in the same house may sit together in the same pew. People receiving Holy Communion are asked to maintain their appropriate distance from the person ahead in line and to remove their masks before approaching the minister. It remains strongly suggested and highly recommended to receive Holy Communion in one's hands.

Requests for statements detailing your 2020 contributions to Sacred Heart Church can be made by sending an e-mail to the parish office (unitedinthesacredheart@aol.com) or by calling the parish office during regular business hours. Statements are available only to registered members of the parish (those who receive and use their parish envelope or donate to the parish online) and should be available by January 31.

A list of birthdays is included each week in the parish bulletin so we can remember our fellow parishioners in prayer on their special day. Please inform the parish office if you do not wish your birthday to be mentioned. There are over 140 people on our parish files whose date of birth is either incorrect or missing. Postcards were mailed to these people asking for their help in bringing our parish records up to date.

Plans for the 13th Man Up Philly Men's Spirituality Conference are underway. This annual event brings together men from across the archdiocese for an inspiring day of faith and fellowship. Due to social distancing guidelines, planners are evaluating the best manner to hold the Conference. Presenters this year include Bishop Joseph Coffey and Colonel Tom Manion. Bishop Coffey was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and has been an active chaplain with the U.S. Navy for many years. Bishop Coffey is Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Military Services. Colonel Manion served in the United States Marine Corps for over 30 years. He is founder of the Travis Manion Foundation, named after his son, First Lieutenant Travis Manion, USMC, who in April 2007 gave his life for our nation. The Foundation supports our military, the families of the fallen, and helps to create the next generation of leaders. Irish tenor Mark Forrest will return to lead the singing at the Eucharistic Adoration. The Conference will conclude with Mass (not the Sunday vigil Mass) celebrated by Archbishop Pérez. 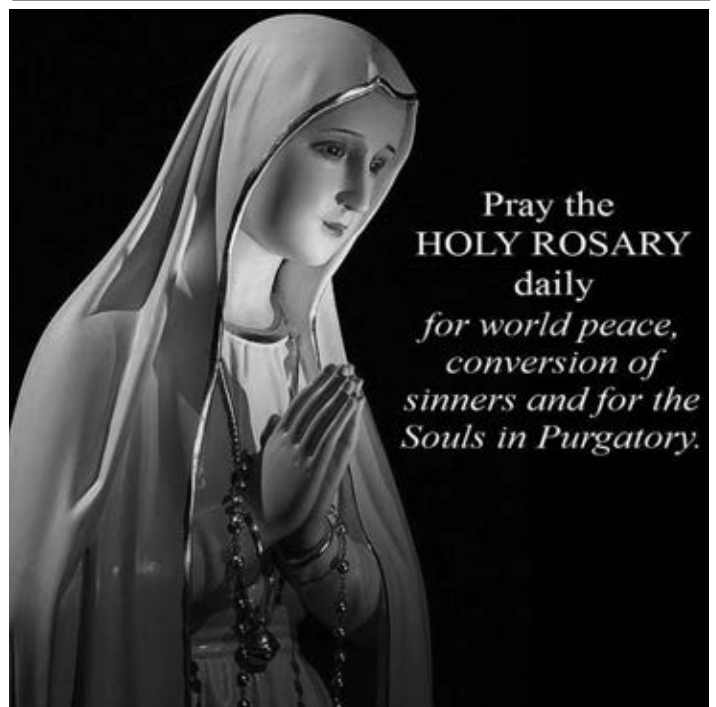

Faith Formation

Apostolic Letter issued “Moto Proprio” by Pope Francis instituting the Sunday of the Word of God.

On September 30, 2019, the 1,599th anniversary of the death of Saint Jerome, Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter directing the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time to be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. The comes from the pope solely on his own initiative, hence the term “moto proprio.” The Memorial of Saint Jerome was chosen as the day to publish the letter because Saint Jerome not only translated the original biblical texts from Hebrew and Greek into Latin, but he is also the source of many commentaries or explanations of several books of Scripture. What follows is a brief summary of the pope’s letter.

Pope Francis cites three background sources for what he is to announce. The first source is Saint Jerome, who wrote in his Commentary on the Book of Isaiah: “Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.” His second source is Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (*Dei verbum*), where, among other things, the importance of Scripture for the life of the Church is explained. The third source is Pope Benedict XVI’s Apostolic Exhortation *Verbum Domini* (“The Word of the Lord”), which emphasizes the use of Scripture in the liturgy.

Francis then writes “that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God.” That particular Sunday is chosen because it falls during the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

He encourages several practices to mark the occasion. Among them are the enthronement of the Sacred Text at Mass, a homily addressing the appropriate honor due to God’s holy Word, and efforts to offer training for those reading the Scriptures at Mass to be “genuine proclaimers of the word.”

Clergy are reminded that Sunday Mass is the only opportunity for many of the faithful to hear the Scriptures and have it applied in their lives. Therefore, homilies are to be well prepared and based on the Word of God. They are neither to be dull, long-winded, nor roam from topic to topic. The homilist who prays and reflects on the Scriptures can speak from the heart and thus reach the hearts of those who listen.

The pope brings forth an image from Revelation 3. Jesus stands at the door and knocks; he will enter and eat with the one who hears his voice and opens the door for him. Jesus is knocking at our door with the words of Sacred Scripture. If we hear his voice in the Scriptures and open the doors of our minds and hearts to him, we will enter our lives and remain forever with us.

The role of the Holy Spirit is mentioned. The Holy Spirit was instrumental centuries ago when the sacred text was written and is effective today in those who hear God’s word. The inspiration of the Holy Spirit continues today whenever the Scriptures are taught by the Church; when the Magisterium, or official teaching office of the church, interprets it; and whenever a believer makes it the norm of his or her spiritual life. “When sacred Scripture is read in the light of the same Spirit by whom it was written, it remains ever new.”

The Holy Father tells of a couple of challenges Scripture itself gives. One is from Ezekiel, where the word of God is described as both sweet and bitter. Its bitterness comes from personal experiences of both the difficulties of our daily living of the Word and its rejection as meaningless for life. Its sweetness inspires us to share it with others and to announce its certain hope. A second challenge is from the parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man from the Gospel of Luke. One who listens to Sacred Scripture is to be led to practice mercy.

The letter concludes with the pope’s desire for the Sunday of the Word of God to be a means by which people become more familiar with Scripture for their daily living.
