Dear Friends,

The Pontifical Missions Societies of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia each year assigns to each parish a representative from a religious congregation to speak about the congregation's missionary work. The annual Mission Co-op collection goes to support these missions. The Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI) is the group that was assigned to our parish this year. However, due to the many restrictions caused by COVID-19, we will not be having a CMI missionary here to make the Appeal in-person. Instead, the CMI that was supposed to come emailed his talk for me to read at the Masses next weekend.

The Congregation of Carmelites of Mary Immaculate is the first indigenous religious congregation in the Catholic Church in India. It was founded by 3 priests in 1831, one of whom is Saint Kuriakose Chavara. Today the congregation has over 3,000 members, including 10 bishops. Their priests work in 35 countries, including the United States. The Congregation is actively involved in pastoral care, education, health care, mass media, the social apostolate and ecumenism. More than 1,000 seminarians are undergoing different stages of priestly formation. The second collection next weekend will be to support the work of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate.

Registration is open for our parish's Family Catechesis, the new approach being taken for PREP beginning the upcoming school year. Parents are asked to fill out a registration form and send it to the parish office as soon as possible. Registration fees are \$75 for one child and \$150 for two or more children, paid by August 31. The fees increase to \$125 for one child and \$225 for two or more children on September 1. Family Catechesis is endorsed by the archdiocesan Office for Catechetical Formation. Forms are available at the parish office and on the parish website, unitedinthesacredheart.com.

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia has announced a new model for ministry and evangelization for Youth and Young Adults. Two separate and distinct offices are being established, each with its own director and staffing. A hiring process is underway to determine the best possible candidates for these newly established positions. More information about this announcement can be found on the email that was sent to the parish last Monday. If you did not receive the email or are not on the parish email list, please send an email to unitedinthesacredheart@aol.com.





Faith Formation

This year is the 150th anniversary of the First Vatican Council, the twentieth ecumenical council of the Catholic Church. Here is a summary of the fourth and final session, which concerned the primacy and teaching of the Roman pontiff. The First Dogmatic Constitution on the Church of Christ (Pastor aeternus) was promulgated on July 18, 1870.

Pastor aeternus turns to Matthew 16: 13-19 and John 21: 15-17 as proofs that Jesus himself appointed Simon Peter the visible head of the church on earth, giving him immediate, true, proper, and direct primacy of teaching and jurisdiction over the entire church. It further declared that it is the divine will for Peter to have perpetual successors, that the primacy given to Peter is to be handed down to his successors, and the Roman pontiff is the successor of Peter. Those who believe otherwise are to be excommunicated.

The authority of the pope is ordinary and immediate over each and all churches and each and all pastors and faithful. All clergy and faithful are bound to submit in obedience in faith and morals as well as discipline and governance to the Vicar of Christ. In this way, all members of the church become one flock under one shepherd.

It decreed that since the pope governs the whole church, he is the supreme judge of the faithful and in all cases that fall under church jurisdiction may be brought to him for judgment. There is no higher authority or revision. Decisions by a pope cannot be appealed to a future ecumenical council, as if it were an authority superior to that of the Roman pontiff.

The final part of this document, and what some may call the most important teaching that came from Vatican I, center on papal infallibility. Years prior to Vatican I, Pius IX in 1854 declared infallibly the Dogma of Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. At Pius' insistence, the Council addressed issue of papal infallibility so that its meaning would be clearly understood.

After citing supporting documents from previous ecumenical councils and offering reflections on the universal teaching authority of the pope, the Council made the following declaration:

Therefore, faithfully adhering to the tradition received from the beginning of the Christian faith, to the glory of God our Savior, for the exaltation of the catholic religion and for the salvation of the Christian people, with the approval of the sacred council, we teach and define as a divinely revealed dogma that when the Roman pontiff speaks EX CATHEDRA, that is, when, in the exercise of his office as shepherd and teacher of all Christians, in virtue of his supreme apostolic authority, he defines a doctrine concerning faith or morals to be held by the whole church, he possesses, by the divine assistance promised to him in blessed Peter, that infallibility which the divine Redeemer willed his church to enjoy in defining doctrine concerning faith or morals.

Therefore, such definitions of the Roman pontiff are of themselves, and not by the consent of the church, irreformable.

Since Vatican I, the doctrine of infallibility has been used only one time. Pope Pius XII declared in 1950 that Mary, the Mother of God, after her life on earth was completed, was assumed body and soul into heaven.

Five First Saturdays

The Blessed Mother to Sr. Lucia dos Santos on Dec. 10, 1925: See, my daughter, my Heart encircled by thorns with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the First Saturday of five successive months, go to Confession (doesn't have to be that Saturday), receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary.


Why five First Saturdays in particular?

Jesus explained this to Sr. Lucia on May 29-30, 1930, saying: Daughter, the motive is simple: There are five kinds of offenses and blasphemies spoken against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

- a. Blasphemies against the Immaculate Conception
- b. Blasphemies against her virginity
- c. Blasphemies against her divine maternity, at the same time the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all men
- d. Instilling indifference, scorn and even hatred towards this Immaculate Mother in the hearts of children
- e. Direct insults against Her sacred images
