Dear Friends,

Happy Father's Day! We pray that God may shower his abundant blessings upon our fathers, all of whom are being remembered before the Lord at the Masses this weekend.

It is good to see people slowly beginning to return to Mass on the weekend. Last weekend's attendance was slightly more than the previous weekend. In the meantime, it is good to keep a few things in mind. First, the archbishop has still relaxed the obligation to attend Mass on the weekend. Masks are to be worn while in church, except for those exercising their liturgical ministry. All are encouraged to socially distance themselves by sitting towards the end of an available pew. People are asked not to sit in those pews separated by the red markers, which are there to ensure the proper 6-foot distancing between those sitting at the ends of the pews. Those who live in the same house may sit together in the same pew. Regarding the reception of Holy Communion, it is strongly suggested and highly recommended to receive Holy Communion in one's hands. Those receiving Holy Communion are asked to remove their masks before approaching the minister.

Religious Freedom Week begins Monday, June 22, the Memorial of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, and continues to the following Monday, June 29, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Helpful guides from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops are in today's bulletin. Mass intentions for the remainder of 2020 can be obtained at the parish office. A donation of \$10 per Mass is requested.

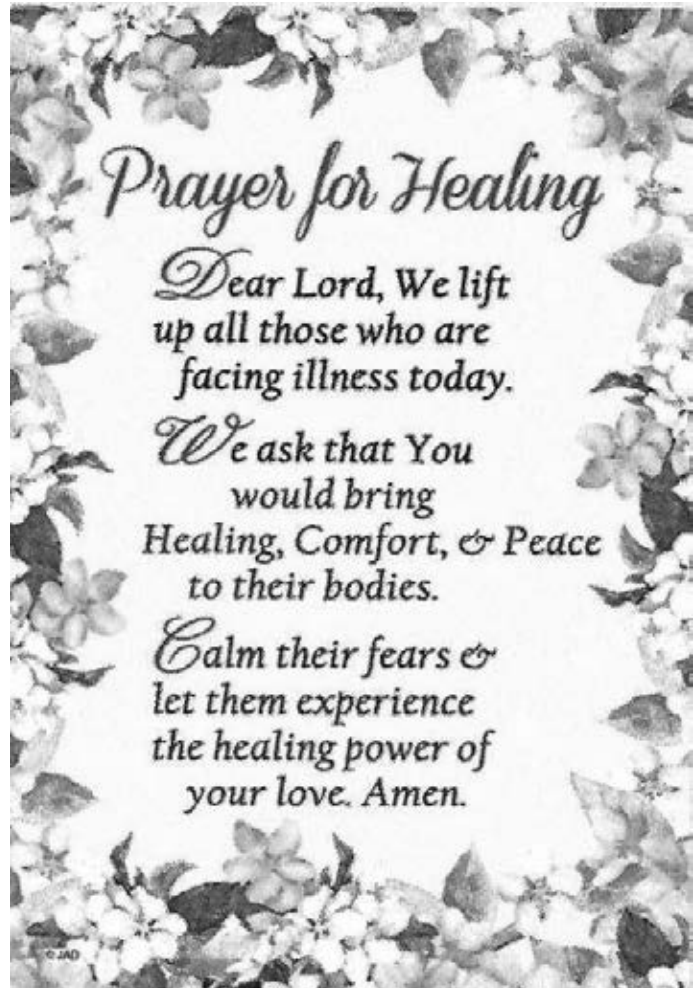

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK

Religious Freedom Week takes place each year between June 22, the Memorial of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, and June 29, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. The following is taken from the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Monday, June 22 – Memorial of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher Freedom to serve in health care and social services

Pray that governments would respect the consciences of the Little Sisters of the Poor and all Christians who care for the sick and vulnerable.

Reflect: The Church for centuries has carried on the healing ministry of Christ by building institutions dedicated to medicine and accompaniment of the dying. Today, the work of the Little Sisters of the Poor, who serve elderly low-income Americans of all backgrounds, is at risk because of lawsuits brought by California and Pennsylvania against the expanded religious and moral exemption to the HHS mandate, and Catholic hospitals are constantly defending themselves against lawsuits and government orders that try to force them to participate in harmful procedures, such as sterilization, gender reassignment surgery, and even abortion.

Act: Take action to support religious liberty! Text “FREEDOM” to 84576 to receive news updates and action alerts.

Tuesday, June 23 Respect for houses of worship

Pray that people of all faiths would be free to worship without fear of attacks and harassment.

Reflect: The disturbing rise in attacks on houses of worship is an attack on religious freedom. Churches have been desecrated in Europe and North America. Priests all over the world have been killed, even while celebrating liturgies. Mosques and synagogues have been vandalized, while there has been a rise in attacks on Jews and Muslims who are simply going about their daily life.

Act: Take time to pray a decade of the Rosary, fast from a meal, or spend time before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, offering up your act as a sacrifice in reparation for sins against human dignity. Then, support increased funding for the FEMA Nonprofit Security Grant Program, which provides grants to nonprofits, including houses of worship, to improve security.

Wednesday, June 24 – Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist Religious Minorities in China

Pray for the freedom of the Church in China, and that the rights of all religious minorities would be respected.

Reflect: Under the Chinese Communist Party, Chinese citizens have limited religious freedom. Since 2013, religious persecution intensified under a government campaign to have religions conform to government-sanctioned interpretation of Chinese culture. While the Vatican has reached a provisional agreement with China on the issue of episcopal appointments, reports of persecution by the Chinese government persist.

Act: Solidarity with people of faith in other countries begins with learning about their struggles. Stay informed by signing up for the USCCB’s religious liberty newsletter, First Freedom News.

Thursday, June 25 Adoption and foster care

Pray that children waiting to be placed in a loving home and the caregivers who selflessly serve those children will find strength and support from the Church.

Reflect: Caring for “the orphan” is a demand of the gospel. While more children are waiting to be placed in families, faith-based child welfare providers are being targeted for closures because of their religious convictions. Intolerance for religious views has real consequences, and in this case, it is vulnerable children who have suffered.

Act: The Child Welfare Provider Inclusion Act (CWPIA) would prohibit the federal government and any state that receives certain federal funding from discriminating against child welfare service providers on the basis that they decline to provide a child welfare service that conflicts with their sincerely held religious beliefs or moral convictions. Contact your U.S. Senators and Representative today and ask them to co-sponsor and support the CWPIA.

Friday, June 26

Border wall dispute in Diocese of Brownsville

Pray that the freedom of the local churches on the U.S. southern border will be respected.

Reflect: The proposed barrier on the southern border would run through land owned by the Diocese of Brownsville, and so the federal government would have to take the land to build the wall or fence. Freedom of the Church means that the Church cannot be impeded by civil authorities from engaging in her mission. That mission includes ministry to those fleeing violence and poverty.

Act: The Diocese of Brownsville is defending itself using the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA), which provides with people of all faiths with protection against government intrusion. However, the RFRA is under attack. The “Do No Harm Act” and the “Equality Act” weaken RFRA. You can promote the freedom of religion today by encouraging your Representative to protect people of faith and do no harm to RFRA!

Saturday, June 27

Catholic Schools

Pray that Catholic schools in our country would be free to teach the truth about God and his creation.

Reflect: Catholic schools owe their origin in part due to the wave of 19th Century Catholic immigrants who felt unwelcome in the “public” school system. Since then, Catholic schools have been significant anchor institutions in many neighborhoods. Education is what Catholics do, and an America without Catholic schools is unimaginable.

Act: Take action to support religious liberty! Text “FREEDOM” to 84576 to receive news updates and action alerts.
