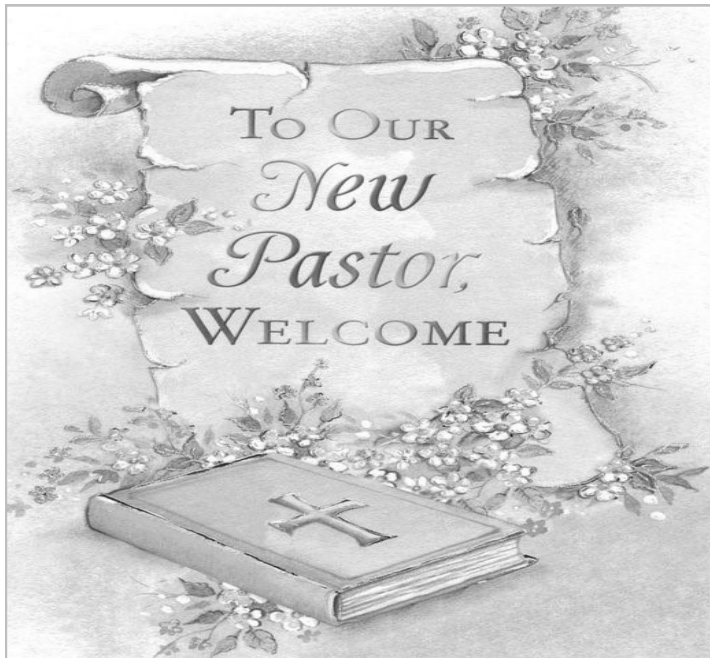

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK

Religious Freedom Week takes place each year between June 22, the Memorial of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, and June 29, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. What follows is adapted from the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Monday, June 28 – St. Irenaeus, Bishop and Martyr Pope Francis' Solidarity with Beleaguered Christians in Iraq

Pray for Christians in Iraq, and that people of all faiths in the land of Abraham may live in peace.

Reflect: Most of Pope Francis' visit to Iraq March 5-8, 2021 was to express solidarity with Iraqi Christians. Although ISIS is defeated today, the threat from extremists remains as Christians who return to Mosul and the Nineveh Plains are often still subject to harassment, intimidation, and extortion; the task of rebuilding is daunting.

Act: Various international Catholic agencies are providing humanitarian assistance to the millions who have been affected and displaced by these conflicts in Iraq. You can join these efforts by donating to the Knights of Columbus Persecuted Christian fund. Support our brothers and sisters in the Middle East today.

Tuesday, June 29 – Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul Free Speech

Pray that Christians will have the courage to speak the truth with kindness and clarity, even in the face of adversity.

Reflect: One of the promises of our country is that many voices, even the ones expressing minority views, have a right to express themselves. Is that promise being fulfilled? Earlier in the year Amazon removed a book by a prominent commentator that expressed problems with gender ideology. Twitter suspended the account of a Catholic news outlet for noting a government official who claims to be a transgender woman is a biological male. On the feast day of Saints Peter and Paul, who faced intense hostility, let us resolve to have the courage to speak the truth with grace.

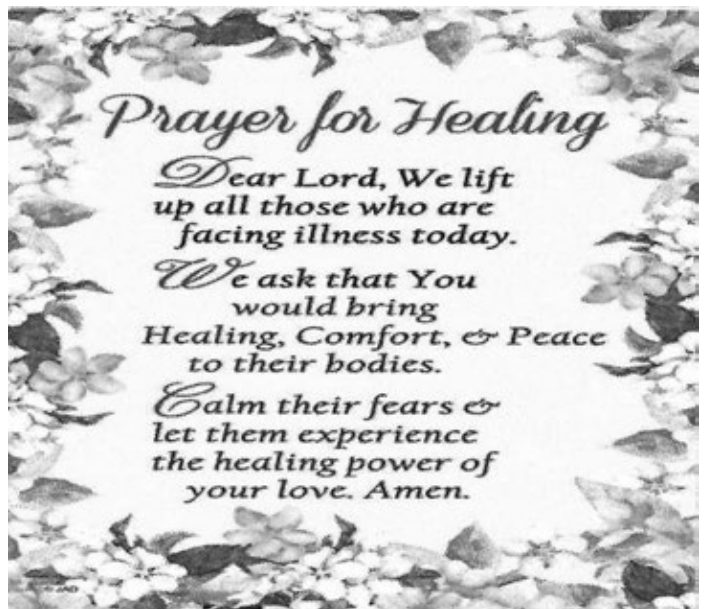

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis recently commended the good work of the **Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD)**, *"which is celebrating 50 years of helping poor Communities in the U.S. to live more worthily by promoting their participation in decisions that affect them."* The Holy Father explains that the mission of the CCHD is to *"accompany people to their struggle for la tierra, el techo y el trabajo" [land, work and housing], and to stand by them when they encounter attitudes of opposition, and contempt."* Francis notes that the economic impact of the pandemic have made this work *"that much more urgent and necessary."*

These words from our Holy Father call us to genuine concern for a relationship with the poor and marginalized members of our larger society and local communities. As faithful Catholics, we follow in the footsteps of Jesus, who demonstrated a deep love for the poor and forgotten people of his day. Like Christ we too must have a heart for those who lack the basic necessities of life which everyone deserves.

With this in mind, I invite your ongoing support of **our annual CCHD collection, which will occur at Masses next weekend (July 3-4)**. As the domestic anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops, CCHD supports community groups to address the root causes of poverty by enabling the most vulnerable members of our community a chance to build a brighter future for themselves and their families. In our country today over 37 million people are still living in poverty, and Philadelphia ranks highest in poverty amongst the largest U.S. cities, with over 23% of its residence living below the poverty line. Many also suffer from educational deficits, language barriers, substance abuse, incarceration, and health challenges. Through CCHD funding, the following good works were supported in our region last year:

- Catholic immigrants from Africa and Asia attended leadership development retreats and webinars.
- an electronics recycling program trained and hired the formally incarcerated who struggle to find a job
- a fresh choice pantry provided free fresh produce, meats and dairy in the Kensington "food desert"
- an immigration services project provided legal and interpretation services in Southwest Philadelphia
- a community outreach program provided ESL, GED and SAT classes to poor Norristown residents
- group homes in Philadelphia supported formerly homeless people in recovery from substance abuse
- a volunteer mentoring and support network offered long-term support for persons with HIV AIDS
- a Philadelphia parish outreach purchased tents and equipment to serve meals outdoors during Covid

We may not know them personally, but these are not strangers to us. They are our brothers and sisters. Who need us to stand with them as they strive to achieve living conditions worthy of their inherent God-given human dignity. The annual CCHD collection next weekend is an opportunity for you to help your neighbors near and far. God bless you for your generous response to this year's CCHD appeal.
