The Legend of the Daffodil



There is a legend that the daffodil first appeared on the night of the Last Supper in the Garden of Gethsemane to comfort Jesus in His hour of sorrow.

May this daffodil remind you of the sacrifice that our Lord Jesus made upon the cross and bring comfort to you.

Dear Friends,

Today we begin Holy Week, the days which commemorate the events central to our faith: the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood (Holy Thursday), our Lord's passion and death (Good Friday) and His rising from the dead (Easter Vigil). The schedule of services for Holy Week and Easter Sunday was mailed to your homes and is reprinted in today's parish bulletin. Your presence and participation at one or all the services this week on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil is encouraged.

Because of the ongoing pandemic situation, the Archdiocesan Office for Divine Worship has issued these directives for the Holy Week celebrations taking place later this week:

- The Mass of Chrism on Holy Thursday at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul will not be open to the public because of space limitations. The Mass will be livestreamed.
- The Washing of Feet during the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday is to be omitted.
- Veneration of the Cross on Good Friday takes place with either a genuflection or a bow. The cross is not to be touched or kissed.

Donations put in the envelope for the annual Pontifical Good Friday Collection are used to support ministries and programs entrusted by the Holy See to the Holy Land Franciscans. Among the beneficiaries of this annual collection are:

- 23 parishes and 3 academic institutions
- 120 men preparing to be priests or brothers
- schools for over 10,000 students, pre-K to grade 12
- a home for 30 children from homes facing domestic violence
- 65 shrines connected with the life of Jesus and the prophets

I will be available for the Sacrament of Penance (Confessions) on Wednesday, March 31 at 1:00 PM and 4:00 PM. Also, please remember that Good Friday is a solemn day of fast and abstinence. Catholics from ages 18 to 59 are seriously bound to eat one main meal and two lesser meals on Good Friday. All Catholics over the age of 14 are seriously bound to refrain from eating meat.

A Rosary will be prayed in church at 9 AM on Holy Saturday morning, April 3.

The Easter Vigil Mass on Saturday begins at 8:00 PM so that the full symbolism of the Risen Jesus, the Light of the world that shines in darkness, may be experienced in its fullest capacity. People attending the Easter Vigil are encouraged to gather at the front steps of the church to witness the lighting and blessing of the fire and the Easter Candle. The Easter Vigil will very likely conclude around 9:30 PM.

The second collection last weekend for Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl amounted to \$1,142. Thank you for your generosity.

Notice was received that Sister Miriam Jude Remar of the Bernardine Franciscan Sisters died March 3, 2021. Sister was a member of Our Mother of Sorrows parish and a teacher at the former Sacred Heart School. May she rest in peace.

Faith Formation

This is the third of a four-part summary of Pope John XXIII's encyclical on social justice, Mater et Magistra ("Mother and Teacher"), which was issued in 1961 to commemorate the 70th anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's landmark encyclical on this subject, Rerum Novarum ("Of New Things").

Probably the most difficult problem of the day, as John saw it, was the imbalance between political communities that are economically advanced and those in the process of development. The former have a high standard of living, while the latter are subject to extreme poverty. Mindful of his position as father of all peoples, John felt obliged to restate and expand on a point he taught earlier. "We are all equally responsible for the undernourished people, [hence], it is necessary to educate one's conscience to the sense of responsibility which weighs upon each and every one, especially upon those who are more blessed with this world's goods."

John then dictates actions to be done out of a sense of justice. Countries which produce consumer goods, especially farm products, in excess of their own needs should come to the assistance of those other countries where large section of the population are suffering from want and hunger. Wealthy nations are to give technical assistance and financial aid for the purpose of helping the less developed nations achieve their own economic and social growth. A new form of colonialism would result if a nation gave aid with a view of gaining control over the political situation in poorer countries as a means to furthering their own plans for world domination.

It pains John to observe the high regard people in economically developed countries put on developments in science, technology, and economics and at the same time spiritual values are ignored, forgotten, or denied.

John calls for nations to work together for their mutual development, because no one nation is self-sufficient to deal with the scientific, technical, economic, social, political and cultural problems of the day. At the same time, he brings out a reality of the Cold War mentality of the day that due to fear and mutual distrust between some nations, vast expenditures of human energy and natural resources being put on projects that are
