Dear Friends,

Tuesday, May 18 is Primary Elections Day. We have a civic duty to participate in our democracy and to choose people to represent us in government. In the days leading up to an election, certain advocacy groups attempt to distribute campaign literature or voter guides on church property and parking lots. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference (PCC) and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia have strict guidelines as to what literature may or may not be made available and distributed on church property. Please know that if you find any other literature distributed on parish property, including the parish parking lot, it was done without the permission, consent, or approval of the archdiocese and me as your pastor.

Decorations for Mother's Day that were placed on gravesites at Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery will be removed beginning Monday, May 24.

The second collection last weekend for Church Maintenance was \$890. Thank you for your generosity.

Mass intentions for July to December 2021 will be accepted beginning Tuesday, May 25.

It is a custom each year around Memorial Day for American flags to be placed at the gravesites of deceased veterans at Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. This is done not by cemetery or parish employees, but by volunteers from Valley Forge VFW Post 7878, who obtain the flags from the county.

Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church, 502 Ford Street in Bridgeport, extends an invitation for all to attend a Solemn Requiem Mass on Memorial Day at 10 AM to be offered for all who gave their lives in service to the nation. A professional choir is being assembled to sing music for the Mass, which will include ancient Gregorian chant and music of the English choral tradition. Father David Ousely, pastor of Saint John the Baptist, is the celebrant. Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church belongs to the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter established by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012. The Ordinariate welcome people with Anglican, Episcopal, and other Protestant backgrounds into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 30% discount on any new pre-purchase of a crypt in the cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the cemetery office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. Interest free financing is available. This offer is good throughout 2021.

You probably noticed in last week's bulletin that my birthday was on Thursday. I turned 65. The priest personnel policy of the archdiocese allows a priest who has reached his 65th birthday to apply for senior priest status. A senior priest is assigned to a parish as a parochial vicar with the understanding he will not be responsible for parish administration or organizations. Archbishop Pérez accepted my request to become a senior priest and is expected to appoint me to a parish closer for me to be able to care for my elderly parents. The naming of my successor, along with official notification where I am being sent, will have taken place on Friday. All clergy appointments in the archdiocese become effective on June 21.

Prayer to ST RITA in special need

O powerful St. Rita, rightly called Saint of the Impossible, I come to you with confidence in my great need. You know well my trials, for you yourself were many times burdened in this life. Come to my help, speak for me, pray with me, intercede on my behalf before the Father.

Faith Formation

In *Fratelli Tutti* ("Brothers All"), Pope Francis teaches us that the divine command to love one another transcends boundaries and distances and invites all to put that teaching into action. The summary of Chapter 5, A Better Kind of Politics, continues.

Charity, the foundation of the church's social doctrine, finds expression in relationships that are close and intimate. Charity is also to be found in larger relationships – social, economic, and political. Political charity transcends any form of individualism. It does not admit any form of relativism.

Concrete efforts to bring about whatever people and their nations need for the sake of their development. Good intentions are not enough.

Francis gives a couple of examples where an act of charity falls under a politician's domain. While an individual may give assisting to someone who is suffering, the politician works to change the social conditions that cause the suffering in the first place. While someone can feed a hungry person, the politician creates a job for him/her.

Politicians would be better off if they were more concerned about finding solutions to offenses against basic human dignity and their consequences, such as human trafficking, slave labor, prostitution, terrorism, drug and weapons trade, and international organized crime, than on a drop in the polls.

"Hunger is criminal; food is an inalienable right." With this statement Francis addresses what he considers a great scandal. Financial speculators manipulate the price of food, tons of food are thrown away, yet millions suffer and die from hunger. The elimination of global hunger needs to be a foremost and imperative goal of politics.

Francis returns to a common theme in the encyclical. Respect for others includes welcoming differences among people. A good politician hears other points of view and makes room for everyone. A good politician will insist different voices be heard. "Disagreements may well give rise to conflicts, but uniformity proves stifling and leads to cultural decay."

The Holy Father concludes this chapter with this observation. Politics is more than bravado, promotion, and media spin, all of which contribute to division, tensions, and cynicism. Rather, "[g]ood politics combines love with hope and with confidence in the reserves of goodness present in human hearts."
