## The Sacrament of Baptism

Dear Friends,

Congratulations to our students who are receiving Holy Communion for the first time today at the 10:15 AM Mass. It is our hope and prayer that they will remain close always to our Eucharistic Lord.

The National Day of Prayer takes place each year on the first Thursday of May. Our next regular parish Holy Hour will take place at 7 PM on Thursday, May 6. All are invited to join in praying the Rosary, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Evening Prayer and Benediction.

The 2021 Catholic Charities Appeal is doing well. After nearly 3 months into the campaign, the Appeal overall has raised \$5.3 million of its \$12.5 million goal. Our parish to date is credited with \$7,218 from 70 donors, representing 42% of our parish goal of \$17,000. All donated funds are deposited into a separate 501 (c) (3) account. Although our registered parishioners received a general mailing from Catholic Charities earlier this year, extra forms and envelopes for the Appeal are available in the church narthex. By way of reminder, **all checks are to be made payable to Catholic Charities Appeal and sent directly to the Appeal in the self-addressed envelope.** Donations to Catholic Charities are not to be sent to the rectory.

Here is the how and where the money is distributed:

- 57% for Catholic Social Services. The Appeal helps fund 100 Social and Nutritional Service services and organizations throughout the archdiocese.
- 13% for Catholic Education, primarily in the form of tuition support for over 100 students enrolled in the archdiocesan schools of Special Education.
- 11% for Offices of Evangelization, Parish and Spiritual Life to support their 18 programs.
- 10% for Local Mission Activities, including offering support to 17 mission parishes in the archdiocese.
- 9% for Clergy, primarily to subsidize benefits for the 158 retired priests of the archdiocese.

*A list of birthdays is included each week in the parish bulletin so we can remember our fellow parishioners in prayer on their special day. Please inform the parish office if you do not wish your birthday to be mentioned.*

*Everyone is encouraged to offer the prayer found elsewhere in today's bulletin that was written by Pope Francis last year asking for an end to the pandemic through Mary's intercession.*

On occasion a person will call the parish office and request a Certificate of Eligibility in order to be a sponsor at a Baptism or Confirmation. A Certificate of Eligibility attests to the fact that the person is a registered member of our parish community; is at least 16; has been baptized, confirmed, and received First Holy Communion; and lives the Catholic faith (is married according to the laws of the church, if married; attends Mass regularly). Sometimes a certificate is not able to be issued for various reasons. The person making the request is either married not according to the laws of the church, living in a relationship of commitment to another outside the Sacrament of Marriage, attends Mass on Sundays infrequently or not at all, or is not a registered member of the parish. The last situation happens frequently when the person was registered as a child with family years ago and then he or she moved out to be on his or her own. A person or an entire household that establishes a new residence, even if it is across the street, ought to register in the Catholic parish of that locality. All Catholics who live in our parish boundaries are encouraged to be registered with Sacred Heart.

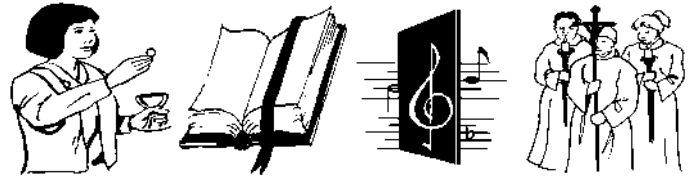

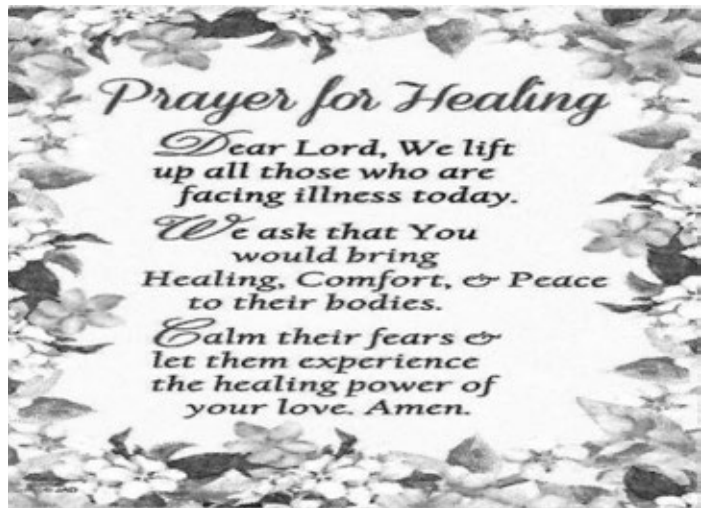

## *Faith Formation*

In *Fratelli Tutti* (“Brothers All”), Pope Francis teaches us that the divine command to love one another transcends boundaries and distances and invites all to put that teaching into action. The summary of the encyclical continues.

Four statements in Chapter 4, *A Heart Open to the Whole World* pretty much provide an accurate picture of Francis’ mindset. We are part of a global society, a human family greater than our own home, neighborhood, or nation. We are either all saved together, or no one is saved. All people know they are part of the greater human family. No state that remains isolated can insure the common good of its population.

His teaching on immigration flows from these statements. People have the right to find a place that meets their basic needs and those of their families. Everyone is to respect that right. Four words summarize what is to be our response to the arrival of immigrants: welcome, protect, promote, and integrate.

Once immigrants have made a home in their new land, it becomes crucial to establish in our societies the concept of *full citizenship* and to reject the discriminatory use of the term *minorities*.

Francis criticizes nations whose policies stem from a form of nationalism that he calls “petty provincialism.” This mentality sees countries closing their doors to outsiders as the means to offer protection to their citizens. Immigrants are looked upon as takers without giving anything in return. This leads to a naïve conviction that the powerful are generous benefactors and the poor are dangerous and useless.

Different cultures are not to be viewed as “enemies” by which people feel the need to protect themselves, but rather as different manifestations of vast depth of human life. A healthy openness to others never threatens one’s own identity.
