Dear Friends,

The Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary announced their assignment changes this past week. Sister Eileen McGuigan, IHM, our Parish Services Director, is being assigned to her community's motherhouse at Immaculata where she will take on the role of Pastoral Visitor to the sisters living there in retirement. Replacing Sister Eileen is Sister MaryAnne Bolger, IHM. Sister MaryAnne, a Norristown native, comes to Sacred Heart after serving as principal of Saint Laurence School in Upper Darby. We offer both our prayers and best wishes to both Sister Eileen and Sister MaryAnne as they take on new positions within their religious community. The changes are effective the beginning of August.

We are already aware that beginning May 13, all who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 need not wear a mask in church. People entering church are not to be asked if they have been vaccinated, as per the Archdiocesan Office for Divine Worship. Here are some further guidelines from that office, most of which go into effect May 31:

- The Presentation of the Gifts at the Offertory may be restored effective immediately.
- Hand sanitizing stations may be removed.
- Requirements for the church to be regularly sanitized, for people to keep 6 feet apart from each other, and to block off every other pew in church are lifted.
- Although all Catholics continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays until further notice, people who are healthy and have not been attending Mass are invited to return.
- The exchange of the Sign of Peace and the distribution of the Precious Blood at Mass continues to be suspended until further notice.
- People are free to receive Holy Communion in their preferred manner, either in the hand or on the tongue. There has not been a single case of a person contracting the coronavirus due to the reception of Holy Communion.

Decorations for Mother's Day that were placed on gravesites at Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery will be removed beginning Monday, May 24.

Thank you for your generosity in the collection for the Ascension holyday which amounted to \$932.

Mass intentions for July to December 2021 will be accepted beginning Tuesday, May 25.

It is a custom each year around Memorial Day for American flags to be placed at the gravesites of deceased veterans at Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. This is done not by cemetery or parish employees, but by volunteers from Valley Forge VFW Post 7878, who obtain the flags from the county.

Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church, 502 Ford Street in Bridgeport, extends an invitation for all to attend a Solemn Requiem Mass on Memorial Day at 10 AM to be offered for all who gave their lives in service to the nation. A professional choir is being assembled to sing music for the Mass, which will include ancient Gregorian chant and music of the English choral tradition. Father David Ousely, pastor of Saint John the Baptist, is the celebrant. Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church belongs to the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter established by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012. The Ordinariate welcome people with Anglican, Episcopal, and other Protestant backgrounds into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Mass on Memorial Day at Sacred Heart Church will be at 9 AM. The parish and Saint Augustine Cemetery Office are closed for the day.

Faith Formation

In *Fratelli Tutti* (“Brothers All”), Pope Francis teaches us that the divine command to love one another transcends boundaries and distances and invites all to put that teaching into action. The summary of the encyclical continues.

Pope Francis begins Chapter 6, *Dialogue and Friendship in Society*, noting that having a dialogue with others that is persistent and courageous quietly helps the world to be a better place. The problem is, the exchange of opinions on social media, what some people think is a dialogue, really is not. Exchanges of opinions are merely parallel monologues. Monologues do not engage others. A true social dialogue is one that involves the ability to respect another’s point of view with an openness to admit it may have legitimate convictions or concerns.

Without specifically saying so, it appears Francis wrote this chapter to address the difficulty people in western civilization (read Europe and North America) have relating to people in other parts of the world. He first reaffirms traditional church teaching by saying all people possess an intrinsic worth; no one is useless or dispensable. He goes on to affirm that a peoples’ culture encompasses their interests, and in the end, how they live their lives. Other people have the right to be themselves and to be different. He then draws this conclusion:

“When one part of society exploits all that the world has to offer, acting as if the poor did not exist, there will eventually be consequences. Sooner or later, ignoring the existence and rights of others will erupt in some form of violence.”

The Holy Father finishes this chapter with a reflection on kindness, a Fruit of the Holy Spirit. He says Paul in Galatians 5 chose the Greek work *chrestotes*, which describes an attitude that is gentle, pleasant, and supportive, not impolite or abrasive. Individuals who are *chrestotes* help make other people’s lives more bearable. Francis asserts the liberation kindness brings. It frees us from any cruelty that infects human relationships. It releases any activity that may cause us to forget that others have the right to be happy. A society where kindness is a hallmark is a society that has undergone a transformation in lifestyles, relationships, and the way ideas are discussed and discussed.
