Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church, 502 Ford Street in Bridgeport, extends an invitation for all to attend a Solemn Requiem Mass on Memorial Day at 10 AM to be offered for all who gave their lives in service to the nation. A professional choir is being assembled to sing music for the Mass, which will include ancient Gregorian chant and music of the English choral tradition. Father David Ousely, pastor of Saint John the Baptist, is the celebrant. Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church belongs to the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter established by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012. The Ordinariate welcome people with Anglican, Episcopal, and other Protestant backgrounds into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Mass on Memorial Day at Sacred Heart church will be at 9 AM. The parish and Saint Augustine Cemetery Office are closed for the day.

Father James Lyons, former parochial administrator of Saint Augustine Church, is hosting a pilgrimage to Italy with the Passion Play of Oberammergau. Departure is May 31, 2022 from Philadelphia International Airport. The tour includes stops in Munich, Innsbruck, Venice, Florence, Assisi, and Rome. Return to Philadelphia is June 10, 2022. Price is \$4,736 per person, double occupancy and includes round trip airfare, accommodations, taxes, service charges, and most meals. Anyone interested is asked to contact me for a brochure.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 30% discount on any new pre-purchase of a crypt in Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the cemetery office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. This offer is good throughout 2021.

Monsignor George Majoros, former parochial vicar here at Sacred Heart, was appointed by Pope Francis to be the Missionary of Mercy for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. All Missionaries of Mercy, including Monsignor Majoros, are granted permission by the Holy Father to absolve sins that are reserved to the Holy See for forgiveness. Examples of these sins are the desecration of the Blessed Sacrament and the recording of what is said during a Confession, whether real or simulated, and/or disclosing what was said on social media. Monsignor is available for Confession on the first Sunday of each month at 5:30 PM at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, 18th Street and Benjamin Franklin Parkway, Philadelphia, PA 19103.

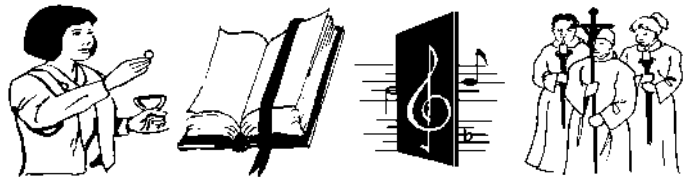

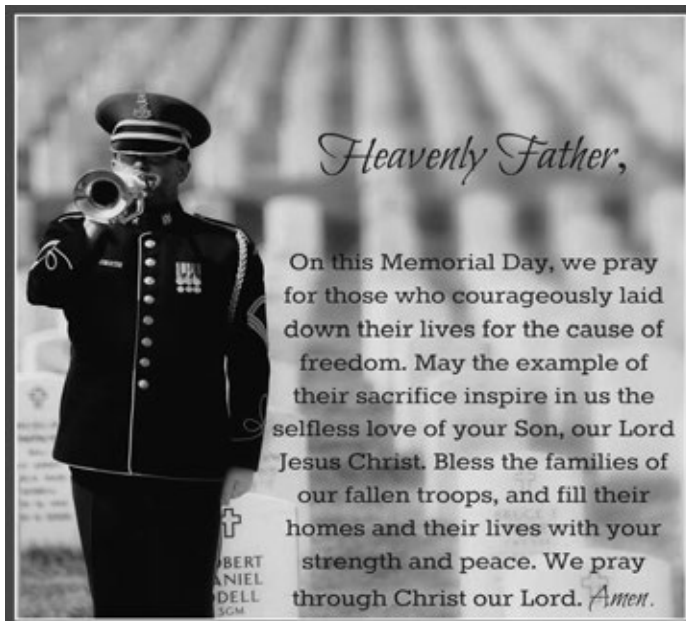

Faith Formation

In *Fratelli Tutti* (“Brothers All”), Pope Francis teaches us that the divine command to love one another transcends boundaries and distances and invites all to put that teaching into action. The summary of the encyclical continues.

The main themes in Chapter 7, *Paths of Renewed Encounter*, are peace and forgiveness. Truth and justice and mercy are essential to develop peace. Truth leads to reconciliation and forgiveness, not to revenge. The path to peace involves getting people to work together in pursuing the common good. The building of a nation’s social peace must put the human person at the center of all political, social, and economic activity. It is a work that never ends. “Violent public demonstrations ... do not help in finding solutions.”

It helps to remember that there is no place in the Gospels where Jesus promoted violence or intolerance. Books of the New Testament tell us it was through continued patience, tolerance, and understanding that the first Christians were able to live in a pagan world marked with corruption and abnormalities.

The command of Christ to love one another is universal and without exception. It applies even to the person who is also an oppressor. It is accomplished by seeking methods to make the oppressor end his harmful actions. Francis adds this about justice and forgiveness: “If a criminal has harmed me or a loved one, no one can forbid me from demanding justice and ensuring that this person – or anyone else – will not harm me, or others, again. This is entirely just; forgiveness does not forbid it but actually demands it.”

Forgiveness does not mean forgetting. We cannot forget the Shoah, Hiroshima, and Nagasaki. We cannot forget past or present persecutions, slave trades, or ethnic killings. “We can never move forward without remembering the past.” Forgiveness is manifested in those who choose not to resort to vengeance. “Revenge never truly satisfies victims. ... Revenge resolves nothing.”

Francis concludes Chapter 7 addressing war and the death penalty. He sees them as “false answers that do not resolve the problems they are meant to solve.” Even though the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* admits the use of military force as a legitimate national defense, the development of biological, chemical, and nuclear weapons in our day is bringing the uncontrollable destructive power of war to newer heights. “We can no longer think of war as a solution, because the risks will probably always be greater than its supposed benefits.” It is extremely difficult to apply the traditional Just War theory to the contemporary situation. “Every war leaves our world worse than it was before.” Francis advocates putting money used to manufacture nuclear and other military weapons into a global fund whereby world hunger can be ended and the poorest nations can be developed.

Francis’ position on the death penalty is rooted in the teaching of Saint John Paul II, who taught that the death penalty is no longer a necessary form of penal justice. Francis writes, “The death penalty is inadmissible, and the Church is firmly committed to calling for its abolition worldwide.”
