Dear Friends,

A Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers, grandmothers, and godmothers. May the Lord bless you abundantly.

Thursday, May 13 is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Masses for the holyday will be at 7 PM on Wednesday, May 12 and 6:30 AM and 9 AM on Thursday. The parish and cemetery offices are closed for the holyday.

Saturday is the 39<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood. I have been blessed to serve in ten parishes throughout these 39 years and am especially grateful to have been your pastor for the past 4. Thank you for all your prayers and support.

The Primary Elections take place next Tuesday, May 18. We have a civic duty to participate in our democracy and to choose people to represent us in government. In the days leading up to an election, certain advocacy groups attempt to distribute campaign literature or voter guides on church property and parking lots. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference (PCC) and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia have strict guidelines as to what literature may or may not be made available and distributed on church property. Please know that if you find any other literature distributed on parish property, including the parish parking lot, it was done without the permission, consent, or approval of the archdiocese and me as your pastor.

Many thanks to all who made donations for the Mother's Day Mass Remembrance. A total of \$1,690 was received. Also, \$735 was raised in the second collection for the Catholic Home Missions.

Mass intentions for July to December 2021 will begin to be accepted beginning Tuesday, May 25.

It is a custom each year around Memorial Day for American flags to be placed at the gravesites of deceased veterans at Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. Flags are obtained and placed by volunteers from Valley Forge VFW Post 7878 and not by cemetery or parish employees.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 30% discount on any new pre-purchase of a crypt in the cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the cemetery office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. Interest free financing is available. This offer is good throughout 2021.

## *Faith Formation*

In *Fratelli Tutti* (“Brothers All”), Pope Francis teaches us that the divine command to love one another transcends boundaries and distances and invites all to put that teaching into action. The summary of the encyclical continues.

A Better Kind of Politics is the title of Chapter 5. Here Pope Francis attempts to unite two concepts that are usually not thought of together – politics and charity.

Francis sees political propaganda, the media, and shapers of public opinion as promoters of a society that is “individualistic and subservient to unregulated economic interests and societal institutions at the service of those who already enjoy too much power.” He calls for a change of heart, attitudes, and lifestyles. Education, a concern for others, and a well-integrated view of life and spiritual growth are necessary for healthy interpersonal relationships and for allowing society to react against injustices and abuses of power from economic, technology, politics, and the media.

Francis is critical of what he calls a neoliberalism that resorts to the “magic theories of ‘spillover’ or ‘trickle’ – without using the name – as the only solution to societal problems.” He claims the marketplace itself cannot resolve every problem. Any alleged “spillover” does not resolve the inequality that gives rise to new forms of violence threatening the fabric of society. Human dignity must be the center of a sound political life, not the tenets of finance.

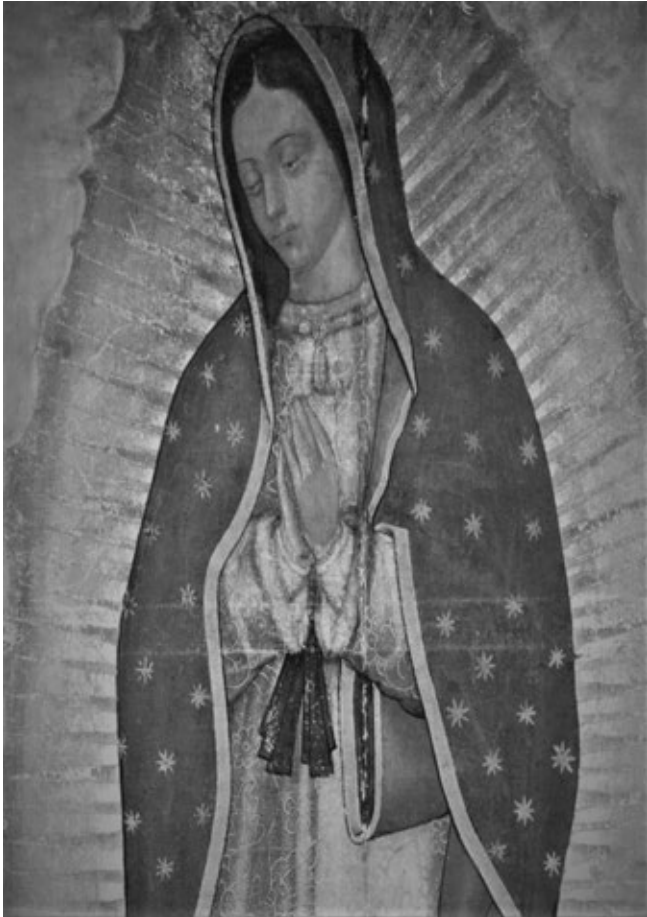
The financial crisis of 2007-2008 offered an opportunity for a new economy to be developed in its wake. Instead, what happened was a greater individualism, less integration, and increased freedom for the powerful.

Francis interprets ‘to give each his own,’ the traditional definition of justice, as meaning no person or group can consider itself absolute and “entitled to bypass the dignity and the rights of other individuals or their social groupings.” Authentic justice in the political arena demands thinking of those who come after us, although he admits this concept “does not serve electoral purposes.”

Due to the number of multinational corporations in the twenty-first century with a stronger economic clout than some nations, Francis argues for the development of stronger and more efficiently organized international institutions. Along those lines, he calls for a reform of the United Nations, economic institutions, and international finance in order that the concept of a “family of nations can acquire real teeth....[T]his calls for clear legal limits to avoid power being co-opted only by a few countries and to prevent cultural impositions or a restriction of the basic freedoms of weaker nations on the basis of ideological differences.”

Since the material Francis covers in this chapter is rather long, his reflections on charity will appear in the next summary.
