Dear Friends,

Today is the Fourth World Day of the Poor. Excerpts from the message of Pope Francis marking this occasion can be found in today's bulletin.

Requests for Announced Masses (those made for a specific day and time) during the first six months of 2021 are being accepted beginning Tuesday, December 1. By way of reminder, the church requires one Mass each weekend and Holyday of Obligation to be offered for the people of the parish. Announced Mass requests are filled on a first come basis. A donation of \$10 per Mass is asked at the time of reservation. Due to the large number of requests that are made for an announced Mass to be offered either on a Saturday evening or a Sunday, it has become necessary to limit such requests to two per person. It is preferred that all requests for Mass intentions, both announced and unannounced, be made in person at the parish office during regular business hours.

The Priest Personnel Manual of the archdiocese states that in addition to his vacation and annual retreat, a priest is entitled to one day off each week, including an overnight. It is understood that some adjustment to the pastoral schedule may need to be made so that the priest's need for a day off can be accommodated. Because of this, requests to reserve an 8 AM Mass on weekdays when I am scheduled to be away either for vacation, fulfilling responsibilities as National Chaplain for the First Catholic Slovak Union, or a day off (usually Thursdays) are unable to be accepted. The parish reserves the right to transfer a weekday Mass intention to another day if circumstances warrant. Thank you for your understanding.

In the event inclement weather causes Upper Merion Area School District to either delay the start of the school day or close the schools, morning Masses will be cancelled and the intentions for those Masses will be transferred to the next available day. The safety of everyone, especially our seniors who attend Mass regularly on weekdays, is paramount.

The next monthly Holy Hour will take place on Wednesday, November 18, the Optional Memorial of Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, the "woman who prays always." The Holy Hour will include Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament and begins at 7 PM. Everyone is invited to participate.

Parents of our PREP students are reminded of the session in church at 7 PM on Thursday, November 19. I will conduct a prayer service for them that includes Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

The list of birthdays is intended for everyone in our parish community to pray for our fellow parishioners celebrating their special day. Please contact the parish office during regular business hours if you wish to have your birthday omitted from the weekly listing or in case of a correction.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 20% discount on any new pre-purchase of a grave, crypt, or niche in Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the Cemetery Office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. This offer is good throughout 2020.

IN NOVEMBER WE HONOR
SAINT ROSE PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE
"The woman who is always praying"

Born in Grenoble, France, in 1769, Rose joined the Society of the Sacred Heart. In 1818 Rose was sent to the United States. She founded a boarding school for daughters of pioneers near St. Louis, the free school west of the Missouri, and a school for Indians. She was known for her courage in facing frontier conditions, her singlemindedness in pursuing her dream of serving Native Americans, and her self-acceptance. This holy servant of God was beatified by Pope Pius XII in 1940 and canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1988.

MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS (ABRIDGED)
FOURTH WORLD DAY OF THE POOR
33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
15 NOVEMBER 2020

“Stretch forth your hand to the poor” (Sirach 7:32). Age-old wisdom has proposed these words as a sacred rule to be followed in life. Today these words remain as timely as ever. They help us fix our gaze on what is essential and overcome the barriers of indifference....

1. ...From the book’s first pages, [Sirach] presents his advice concerning many concrete situations in life, one of which is poverty. He insists that even amid hardships we must continue to trust in God....

2. ...Prayer to God and solidarity with the poor and suffering are inseparable. In order to perform and act of worship acceptable to the Lord, we have to recognize that each person, even the poorest and most contemptible, is made in the image of God.... Time devoted to prayer can never become an alibi for neglecting our neighbor in need. In fact the very opposite is true: the Lord’s blessing descends upon us and prayer attains its goal when accompanied by service to the poor.

3. ...The word of God transcends space and time, religions and cultures.... The decision to care for the poor, for their many different needs, cannot be conditioned by the time available or by private interests, or by impersonal pastoral or social projects. The power of God’s grace cannot be restrained by the selfish tendency to put ourselves always first....Each year, on the World Day of the Poor, I reiterate this basic truth in the life of the Church, for the poor are and always will be with us to help us welcome Christ’s presence into our daily lives (cf. John 12:8).

4. Encountering the poor and those in need constantly challenges us and forces us to think. How can we help to eliminate or at least alleviate their marginalization and suffering? ... The Church certainly has no comprehensive solutions to propose, but by the grace of Christ she can offer her witness and her gestures of charity. She likewise feels compelled to speak out on behalf of those who lack life’s basic necessities....

6. A hand held out is a sign; a sign that immediately speaks of closeness, solidarity and love. In these months, when the whole world was prey to a virus that brought pain and death, despair and bewilderment, how many outstretched hands have we seen! ...Those hands defied contagion and fear in order to offer support and consolation.

7. This pandemic arrived suddenly and caught us unprepared, sparking a powerful sense of bewilderment and helplessness. Yet hands never stopped reaching out to the poor. This has made us all the more aware of the presence of the poor in our midst and their need for help....

...The loss of employment, and of opportunities to be close to our loved ones and our regular acquaintances, suddenly opened our eyes to horizons that we had long since taken for granted....We came to realize how much we need a new sense of fraternity, for mutual help and esteem. Now is a good time to recover “the conviction that we need one another, that we have a shared responsibility for others and the world (Laudato Si, 229). In a word, until we revive our sense of responsibility for our neighbor and for every person, grave economic, financial and political crises will continue.

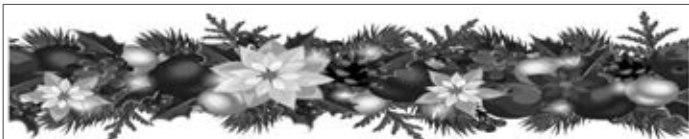
8. This year’s theme – “Stretch forth your hand to the poor” – is thus a summons to responsibility and commitment as men and women who are part of our one human family.... The Apostle [Paul] teaches that the freedom bestowed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ makes us individually responsible for serving others, especially the weakest. This is not an option, but rather a sign of the authenticity of the faith we profess....

9. At the same time, the command: “Stretch forth your hand to the poor” challenges the attitude of those who prefer to keep their hands in their pockets and to remain unmoved by situations of poverty in which they are often complicit.... To sustain a lifestyle which excludes others, or to sustain enthusiasm for that selfish ideal, a globalization of indifference has developed.... We cannot be happy until these hands that sow death are transformed into instruments of justice and peace for the whole world....

10. ...In this journey of daily encounter with the poor, the Mother of God is ever at our side. More than any other, she is the Mother of the Poor. The Virgin Mary knows well the difficulties and sufferings of the marginalized, for she herself gave birth to the Son of God in a stable.... May our prayer to Mary, Mother of the Poor, unite these, her beloved children, with all those who serve them in Christ’s name. And may that prayer enable outstretched hands to become an embrace of shared and rediscovered humanity.
