Dear Friends,

Last weekend's second collection for Church Heat was \$897. Thank you for your generosity.

The Rectory office will close at 2 PM on Wednesday, November 25 for the Thanksgiving Holiday. The Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery will close at 3 PM on Tuesday, November 24. Both offices will reopen at 9 AM on Monday, November 30. Mass on Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, is at 9 AM.

Thank you for your continued financial support of the parish. By way of reminder, it would be very helpful if those who make their contributions to the church by check do not write in the dollar sign (\$) or put xx/100 or no/100 in the box provided for the amount of the check. The scanner frequently misreads checks written with, for example, \$20.00 or \$20 xx/100 or 20 no/100 in that box. What is to be written in that space is 20.00. Checks ought to be written in either blue or black ink. The scanner does not read checks written in other colors. Also, please remember to date and sign your checks. Some people forget to do so.

Requests for Announced Masses (those made for a specific day and time) during the first six months of 2021 are being accepted beginning Tuesday, December 1. By way of reminder, the church requires one Mass each weekend and Holyday of Obligation to be offered for the people of the parish. Announced Mass requests are filled on a first come basis. A donation of \$10 per Mass is asked at the time of reservation. Due to the large number of requests that are made for an announced Mass to be offered either on a Saturday evening or a Sunday, it has become necessary to limit such requests to two per person. It is preferred that all requests for Mass intentions, both announced and unannounced, be made in person at the parish office during regular business hours.

The Priest Personnel Manual of the archdiocese states that in addition to his vacation and annual retreat, a priest is entitled to one day off each week, including an overnight. It is understood that some adjustment to the pastoral schedule may need to be made in order to accommodate the priest's need for a day off. Because of this, requests for a Mass on weekdays I know I am away either for vacation, fulfilling responsibilities as National Chaplain for the First Catholic Slovak Union, or a day off (usually Thursdays) will be put on hold. The parish reserves the right to transfer a weekday Mass intention to another day if circumstances warrant. It is preferred that all requests for Mass intentions, both announced and unannounced, be made in person at the parish office during regular business hours. Thank you for your understanding.

In the event inclement weather causes Upper Merion Area School District to either delay the start of the school day or close the schools, morning Mass will be cancelled and the intentions for that Mass will be transferred to the next available day. The safety of everyone, particularly our seniors who attend Mass regularly on weekdays, is paramount.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 20% discount on any new pre-purchase of a grave, crypt, or niche in Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the cemetery office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. This offer is good through 2020.

Flags at gravesites at Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery will be removed for the winter months beginning Tuesday, December 1. This is because winter weather frequently causes flags to become tattered. Those who wish to have a flag at the grave of their deceased loved one throughout the winter are asked to contact the cemetery office. New flags will be placed at the graves of all veterans by Memorial Day of 2021.

The listing of parishioners' birthdays for the week is intended for our parish community to pray for our fellow parishioners on their special day. Please contact the parish office during regular business hours if you wish to have your birthday omitted from the weekly listing or in case of a correction.

Christmas is almost one month away. It is not too early to make plans to receive the Sacrament of Penance so to be prepared spiritually for this most special celebration. In addition to the usual times for Confessions on Saturday afternoons, Confessions will also be heard on Thursday, December 10 at 7 PM; Saturday, December 19 at 11 AM; and Wednesday, December 23 at 1 PM and 7 PM.

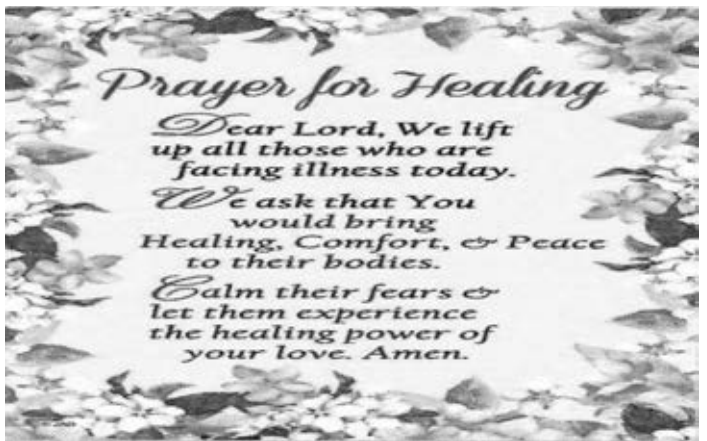

Faith Formation

The Pastoral Constitution of the Church in the Modern World (*Gaudium et spes*) is the last of 16 documents from the Second Vatican Council. Promulgated by Pope Saint Paul VI on December 7, 1965 and addressed to all humanity, *Gaudium et spes* focuses on the human person itself, whole and entire, body and soul, heart and conscience, mind and will. This is the last of an eleven-part summary

The final section of *Gaudium et spes* addresses the establishment of and the building of peace on the earth, so that all people may live in peace with one another. This peace can be accomplished through a spirit of cooperation between developing nations and the advanced nations, especially in regards to the areas of finances and human resources.

Advanced nations, in a spirit of universal cooperation, have a duty to assist developing nations to reach their potential. Most developing nations are, for the most part, unable to make advancements in the global scene unless they are given aid by the advanced nations in the form of gifts, loans, and other forms of investment. Care must be given by advanced nations to respect profits realized by underdeveloped nations, for these countries need the income they receive on the sale of their homemade products to support themselves.

Peace between nations cannot survive when causes of dissension are allowed to exist. Injustice, especially economic inequalities, envy, pride, distrust, and the desire for domination of other peoples must be eliminated. Also, advanced nations engaging in profiteering, national ambitions, political supremacy, militaristic calculations or works that spread or impose ideologies upon the poor nations are not helping to advance the cause for peace.

The procedure of collecting and distributing different forms of aid should be carried out in an orderly fashion in dioceses, nations, and throughout the world. The Church, both through her official channels and through the sincere collaboration of all Christians, must be clearly present in the midst of the community of nations in this work.
