Dear Friends,

The priests of the archdiocese assemble each year with the archbishop at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary at the beginning of Advent for a day of prayer and reflection on the Sacred Priesthood. The 2020 Day of Sanctification for Priests is Monday, November 30. Please pray for all priests of the archdiocese, especially this weekend and on Monday, with the following prayer from the Roman Missal:

*Lord our God, who in governing your people
make use of the ministry of Priests,
grant to these men
a persevering obedience to your will,
so that by their ministry and life
they may gain glory for you in Christ.
Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

Requests for Announced Masses (those made for a specific day and time) during the first six months of 2021 will be accepted beginning Tuesday, December 1. Church law requires one Mass each weekend and Holyday of Obligation to be reserved for the people of the parish. Announced Masses requests are filled on a first come basis. A donation of \$10 per Mass is asked at the time of reservation. Due to the large number of requests that are made for an announced Mass to be offered either on a Saturday evening or a Sunday, it has become necessary to limit such requests to two per person.

The Priest Personnel Manual of the archdiocese states that in addition to his vacation and annual retreat, a priest is entitled to one day off each week, including an overnight. It is understood that some adjustment to the pastoral schedule may need to be made in order to accommodate the priest's need for a day off. Because of this, requests for a weekday Mass on days when I am scheduled to be away either for vacation, fulfilling responsibilities as National Chaplain for the First Catholic Slovak Union, or a day off (usually Thursdays) will be put on hold unless there is a change in my schedule. The parish reserves the right to transfer a weekday Mass intention to another day if circumstances warrant. Thank you for your understanding.

The Parish Office will be closed on the Fridays of December. In addition, both the Parish and Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery Offices will be closed next Monday and Tuesday, December 7 and 8.

Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary's annual Christmas Concert is a live-stream event this year due to the coronavirus. The Concert, featuring the seminary choir and musicians, will take place next Sunday, December 6, beginning at 2 PM. The Concert can be viewed through the seminary's website, scs.edu.

The second collection next weekend is the annual appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Many religious communities in the United States do not have enough retirement savings and are struggling to provide for their aging members. COVID-19 has only increased these challenges. Thank you in advance for your generosity to this Appeal.

The monthly Holy Hour consists of the praying of the Rosary, Evening Prayer, and Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. The next Holy Hour takes place at 7 PM on Friday, December 11 and will be in honor of Our Lady of Loreto. All are invited.

Booklets with spiritual reflections for Advent from the Diocese of Saginaw are available in the back of church. Please feel free to take one as you leave church.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Soon our parishes will be conducting the collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious. This annual appeal benefits 30,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests—women and men who have consecrated their lives to serving God and the Church. We are blessed to have 70 religious congregations present and serving within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. These 70 religious congregations represent approximately 2,500 men and women religious. Of this number, over 900 are retired.

Many religious communities struggle to provide for their aging members. Vocations to religious life have diminished but lifespans have increased. The result is that far fewer younger members are available to support the retirement and eldercare needs of senior members. In 2018, 70 percent of the religious communities providing data to the National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO) had a median age of 70 or higher.

Recognizing that this is but one of many worthy causes in need of assistance, I ask simply that you give what you can. Your monetary support and prayers are a means of thanking the many women and men religious for their faithful service to Catholic Education, healthcare, and many other services offered by religious women and men.

The annual Retirement Fund for Religious collection will be held December 5-6, 2020 in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The appeal is coordinated by the National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO). In addition to sponsoring the annual appeal, the NRRO offers assessment tools, educational programming, services, and resources that enable religious communities to evaluate and prepare for Long-term retirement needs.

Please pray for our consecrated religious and please also encourage support for this national collection scheduled for December 5-6, 2020 in our local parishes.
