Dear Friends,

The Pennsylvania Catholic Conference (PCC) has produced a Presidential Candidate Comparison document and a State Legislative Voters Guide to assist Catholics as they prepare to vote in the General Election on November 3. These documents are intended to educate the faithful about candidates and their positions on issues of importance to Catholic voters. They are the only materials currently sanctioned for distribution within parishes and other Archdiocesan entities. The State Legislative Voters Guide is inserted in today's bulletin; the 17th Senatorial District and the 149th House District are within the parish boundaries of Sacred Heart. The Presidential Candidate Comparison was included in last weekend's parish bulletin. Both documents are also available online at archphila.org and catholicphilly.com. Please know that neither the PCC, nor the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, nor the Archdiocese of Philadelphia endorse or oppose any candidate for political office.

The archdiocese sent out a communication asking for parishes to conduct a second collection to assist those affected by the wildfires in California, Oregon and Washington, and Hurricane Laura that devastated parts of Louisiana. We will take the second collection this weekend at all the Masses.

Last weekend's collection for the Maintenance Fund came to \$730. Thank you for your generosity.

Our monthly Holy Hour in honor of Our Lady of Fatima will take place Tuesday, October 13, beginning at 7 PM. The Holy Hour consists of praying the Holy Rosary, Evening Prayer, and Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. All are invited to attend.

The Annual Archdiocesan Wedding Anniversary Mass, originally planned for earlier this year, is now scheduled for Saturday, October 17, 2020 at 5:15 PM at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, 18th Street and Benjamin Franklin Parkway, in Philadelphia. Archbishop Pérez is the principal celebrant and homilist. Married couples marking their first, fifth, tenth, twenty-fifth, and fiftieth wedding anniversaries are invited. Friends and family are welcome and encouraged to attend. Please go to phillycatholiclife.org or call the Office for Life and Family at 215-587-0500 to RSVP.

Our parish's annual period of Eucharistic Adoration, also known as the Forty Hours Devotion, will begin after the 10:15 AM Mass on Sunday, October 25 and conclude on Tuesday, October 27. Since it is important for at least one person to be in church while the Most Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar, you are encouraged to indicate the half-hour you will be able to be present before the Eucharistic Lord by signing a paper in the rear of the church. Sunday's period of adoration will end at 5 PM with a prayer service and Benediction. Evening Prayer and Benediction at 7 PM will conclude Monday's adoration. Forty Hours will end on Tuesday with a prayer service and Benediction beginning at 7 PM.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 20% discount on any new pre-purchase of a grave, crypt, or niche in Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the Cemetery Office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. This offer is good throughout 2020.

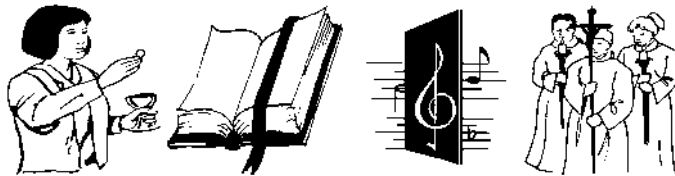

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The annual, worldwide celebration of our shared call to Mission, **World Mission Sunday**, is celebrated on **October 18, 2020** this year. That Sunday will also mark the beginning of a year-long commemoration marking the **110th Anniversary** of the *Pontifical Mission Societies* in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

The Truth About "Separation of Church and State"

Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore has said, "For

some time now, we have viewed with growing alarm the on-going erosion of religious liberty in our country." For example, almost daily, we see instances of students, athletic coaches and members of the military being reprimanded for openly expressing their religious beliefs. Many Americans are surprised to learn that the words "Separation of Church and State" do not appear in the First Amendment or anywhere else in the Constitution. This phrase is traced to a letter President Jefferson wrote in 1802 to the Danbury Baptist Church in response to their concerns about Religious Freedom. In it, Jefferson quoted the First Amendment, "Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or the free exercise there of..." and commented, "Thus building a wall of separation between Church and State." By using the phrase "wall of separation", he intended to give assurance *that the federal government would not interfere with peoples' right to worship God as well as to practice their beliefs.* He was assuring that there would be Freedom of Religion for all not Freedom FROM Religion. Sadly, today many choose to reverse the real meaning of Jefferson's words to place restrictions on the people instead of on government.

It's obvious from the writings of Jefferson and many other Founding Fathers that they believed all of our liberties, including religious freedom, are not provided to us by government, but are a gift from God. We have been blessed to live in a Country that recognizes this God-given freedom and we look to Our Lady, Patroness of America, to help us to protect it.

We pray:

Blessed Mother Mary, we place our country in your care, in the sure hands that protected the Child Jesus. Teach us to imitate Jesus as you did, and always to follow Him with your courage so that Religious Liberty, His gift to mankind, may be preserved throughout this land. Amen

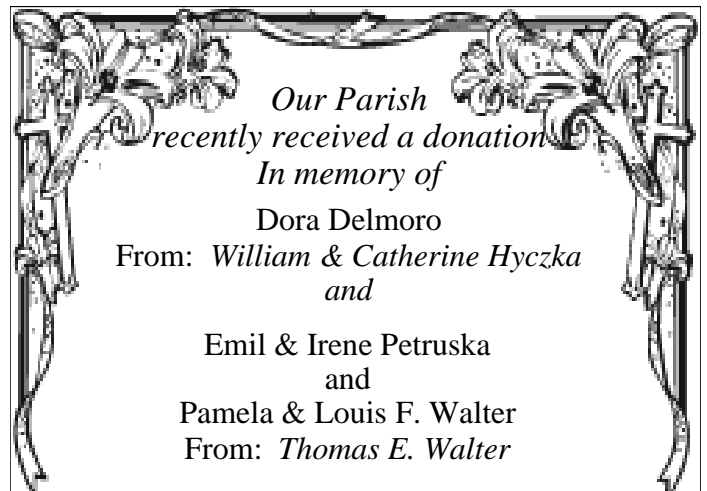
