Dear Friends,

Today is Mission Sunday. Pope Francis' message for Mission Sunday is printed in today's parish bulletin.

The Pennsylvania Catholic Conference (PCC) has produced a Presidential Candidate Comparison document and a State Legislative Voters Guide to assist Catholics as they prepare to vote in the General Election on November 3. These documents are intended to educate the faithful about candidates and their positions on issues of importance to Catholic voters. They are the only materials currently sanctioned for distribution within parishes and other Archdiocesan entities. Hard copies of each were inserted in the parish bulletins earlier this month. You may obtain an extra copy by going online to archphila.org and catholicphilly.com. Please know that neither the PCC, nor the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, nor the Archdiocese of Philadelphia endorse or oppose any candidate for political office.

Last weekend's second collection to help aid victims of the hurricanes in Louisiana and wildfires in California amounted to \$424. Thank you for your generosity.

Our parish's annual period of Eucharistic Adoration, also known as the Forty Hours Devotion, will begin after the 10:15 AM Mass next Sunday, October 25 and conclude on Tuesday, October 27. Since it is important for at least one person to be in church while the Most Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar, you are encouraged to indicate the half-hour you will be able to be present before the Eucharistic Lord by signing a paper in the rear of the church. Sunday's period of adoration will end at 5 PM with a prayer service and Benediction. Evening Prayer and Benediction at 7 PM will conclude Monday's adoration. Forty Hours will end on Tuesday with a prayer service and Benediction beginning at 7 PM.

Registered parishioners of Sacred Heart parish are eligible to receive a 20% discount on any new pre-purchase of a grave, crypt, or niche in Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery. Interest-free financing is available. Please call the Cemetery Office (610-272-4088) during regular business hours for more information. This offer is good throughout 2020.

A Virtual Rosary Rally for Migrants and Refugees is planned for this Thursday, October 22 at 8 PM. All are invited to join the Rally in prayer or in spirit to ask for the intercession of the Blessed Mother and Pope Saint John Paul II on his feast day for the protection of migrants and refugees around the world who have been displaced due to violence or economic hardships in their countries of origin. 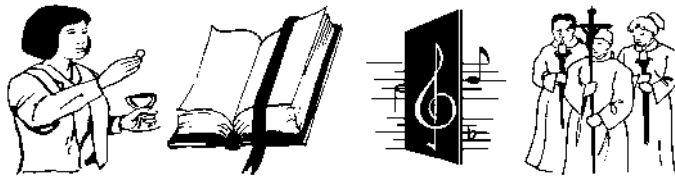

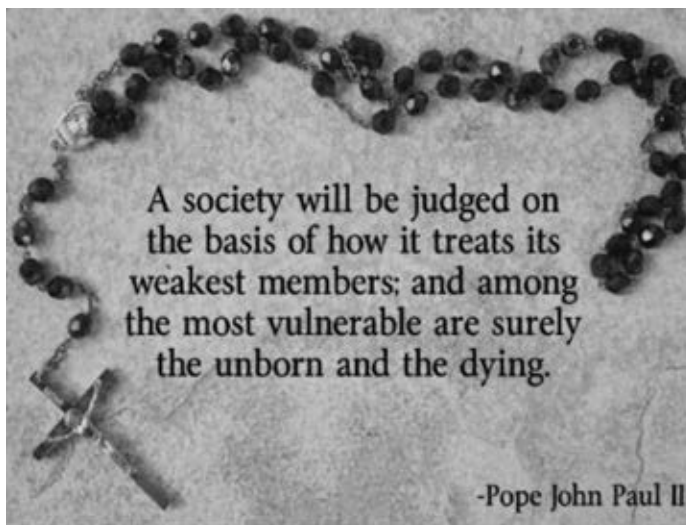

Message for World Mission Day by Pope Francis

Our filial relationship with God is not something simply private, but always in relation to the Church. Through our communion with God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we, together with so many of our other brothers and sisters, are born to new life. This divine life is not a product for sale...but a treasure to be given, communicated, and proclaimed: that is the meaning of mission. We received this gift freely and we share it freely....

The Church is on mission in the world. Faith in Jesus Christ enables us to see all things in their proper perspective, as we view the world with God's own eyes and heart. Hope opens us up to the eternal horizons of the divine life that we share. Charity, of which we have a foretaste in the sacraments and in fraternal love, impels us to go forth to the ends of the earth (Mic 5:3; Mt 28:19; Acts 1:8, Rom 10:18)....

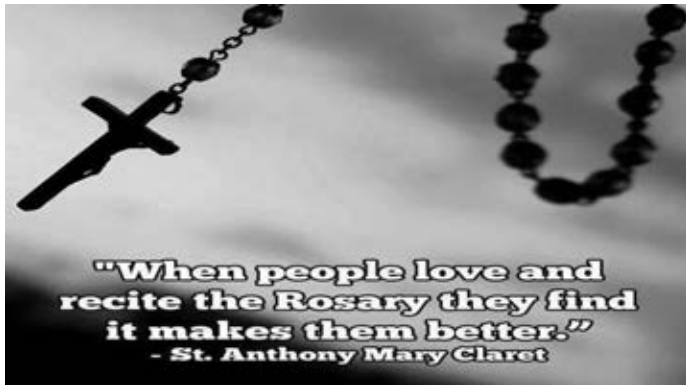

The missionary mandate touches us personally: I am a mission, always; you are a mission, always; every baptized man and woman is a mission. People in love never stand still: they are drawn out of themselves; they are attracted and attract others in turn; they give themselves to others and build relationships that are life-giving. As far as God's love is concerned, no one is useless or insignificant. Each of us is a mission to the world, for each of us is the fruit of God's love. Even if parents can betray their love by lies, hatred, and infidelity, God never takes back his gift of life....

This life is bestowed on us in baptism, which grants us the gift of faith in Jesus Christ, the conqueror of sin and death. Baptism gives us rebirth in God's own image and likeness, and makes us members of the Body of Christ, which is the Church. In this sense, baptism is truly necessary for salvation for it ensures that we are always and everywhere sons and daughters in the house of the Father, and never orphans, strangers, or slaves.... For baptism fulfills the promise of the gift of God that makes everyone a son or daughter in the Son. We are children of our natural parents, but in baptism we receive the origin of all fatherhood and true motherhood: no one can have God for a Father who does not have the Church for a mother (cf. Saint Cyprian).

Our mission, then, is rooted in the fatherhood of God and the motherhood of the Church.... This mission is part of our identity as Christians; it makes us responsible for enabling all men and women to realize their vocation to be adoptive children of the Father, to recognize their personal dignity and to appreciate the intrinsic worth of every human being, from conception to natural death...

Today, too, the Church needs men and women who, by virtue of their baptism, respond generously to the call to leave behind home, family, country, language, and local Church, and to be sent forth to the nations, to a world not yet transformed by the sacraments of Jesus Christ and his holy Church. By proclaiming God's word, bearing witness to the Gospel and celebrating the life of the Spirit, they summon to conversion, baptize, and offer Christian salvation.... Faith in the Easter event of Jesus; the ecclesial mission received in baptism, the geographic and cultural detachment from oneself and one's own home; the need for salvation from sin and liberation from personal and social evil: all these demand the mission that reaches to the very ends of the earth....

We entrust the Church's mission to Mary our Mother. In union with her Son, from the moment of the Incarnation the Blessed Virgin set out on her pilgrim way. She was fully involved in the mission of Jesus, a mission that became her own at the foot of the Cross: the mission of cooperating, as Mother of the Church, in bringing new sons and daughters of God to birth in Spirit and in faith.

**The Truth About
"Separation of
Church and State"**

Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore has said, "For some time now, we have viewed with growing alarm the on-going erosion of religious liberty in our country." For example, almost daily, we see instances of students, athletic coaches and members of the military being reprimanded for openly expressing their religious beliefs. Many Americans are surprised to learn that the words "Separation of Church and State" do not appear in the First Amendment or anywhere else in the Constitution. This phrase is traced to a letter President Jefferson wrote in 1802 to the Danbury Baptist Church in response to their concerns about Religious Freedom. In it, Jefferson quoted the First Amendment, "Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or the free exercise thereof..." and commented, "Thus building a wall of separation between Church and State." By using the phrase "wall of separation", he intended to give assurance *that the federal government would not interfere with peoples' right to worship God as well as to practice their beliefs.* He was assuring that there would be Freedom of Religion for all not Freedom FROM Religion. Sadly, today many choose to reverse the real meaning of Jefferson's words to place restrictions on the people instead of on government.


It's obvious from the writings of Jefferson and many other Founding Fathers that they believed all of our liberties, including religious freedom, are not provided to us by government, but are a gift from God. We have been blessed to live in a Country that recognizes this God-given freedom and we look to Our Lady, Patroness of America, to help us to protect it.
