From the Pastor's Desk

Town Hall Meeting

Immediately following all Masses during the weekend of October 2/3 there will be a "Town Hall Meeting" wherein we can speak with one another regarding the strengthens of the parish and what it is that we need to do to witness to the love of Christ more effectively in Bridgeport and beyond.

I will address the congregation as will Sr. MaryAnne in her capacity as Parish Services Director. Among the topics we will address are the 40 Hours Devotions which will be held October 24- 26 and its importance as a new spiritual beginning for the parish.

Other topics will include your thoughts regarding the possibility of a festival during the summer of 2022. I want to take a vote on that weekend as to whether the parishioners think that we can effectively "pull off" a successful festival which requires much hard work and dedication.

I would like us to talk about and vote on the possibility of returning viewings (wakes) to the church – both the positives and negatives concerning such a practice.

The religious education program has dramatically shrunk over the course of the last several years. We need to figure out a better way to reach the families of children so to effectively catechize and evangelize them.

Our concern for the poor needs also to be addressed as well as our ability as a parish to be of greater service to the wider community.

We have many senior citizens in the parish, but we have no special club or group for them. Sr. MaryAnne will address that issue along with some community building events like a spaghetti dinner.

I would also like to spend some time addressing the needs which you think we should address. I will also take any questions and will try my best to answer them.

The role of a pastor is demanding in some ways, but it is also a cause of joy as the pastor sees his people respond to the call of holiness. I want our relationship to be strong and filled with love and understanding. I want you to know that I wish to be of service and that I value very highly your input and recommendations.

Together under the guidance of the Holy Spirit we can be the disciples Christ calls us to be. We really can be "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world."

In the following weeks, pray dear friends, that the Holy Spirit will guide our deliberations on October 2/3 so that we will grow strong in faith, persevere in hope, and valiant in love.

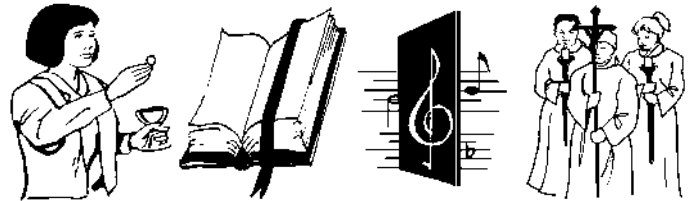

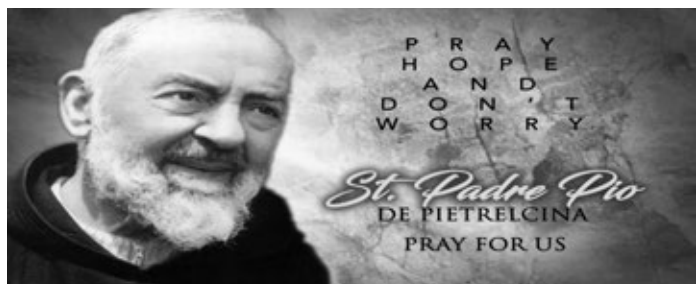

unborn babies and to help their mothers.

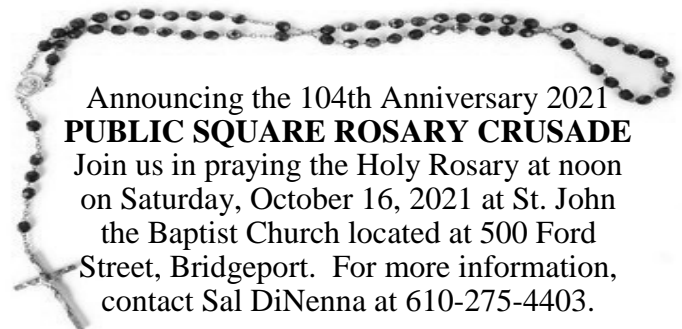
