Dear Friends,

Monday, September 7, is Labor Day. Mass will be at 9 AM. The parish and the cemetery office will be closed for this national holiday.

The Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) at Sacred Heart Parish is taking a new direction this year with the introduction of a program known as Family Catechesis. Family Catechesis is endorsed by the Office for Catechetical Formation of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The Program is intended to assist parents/guardians in their duty as the primary teachers of their children in the ways of faith with the support of our parish catechists. By sharing in the formal instruction of the teachings and practices of the Church, parents/guardians and our parish catechists work together to establish a foundation and formation in the Catholic faith within our children that will enable them to grow in their relationship with God. The first meeting for students and their parents is at 8:30 AM on Sunday, September 20.

Families who have yet to register their child(ren) for Family Catechesis are encouraged to do so. A registration form can be downloaded from the parish website. Registration fees are \$75 for one child and \$150 for two or more children. After September 20, the fees increase to \$125 for one child and \$225 for two or more children.

The next monthly Holy Hour will be held Tuesday, September 15, the Memorial of Our Mother of Sorrows. The Holy Hour will start at 7 PM with the praying of a Litany to Our Mother of Sorrows at the outdoor shrine at the corner of E. 4th and Jefferson Streets. Following the litany, we will process into church for the praying of the Rosary and then Evening Prayer and Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. All are invited.

All are reminded to socially distance themselves while in church by maintaining a minimum distance of 6 feet from the person next to you. People who live in the same house are permitted to sit together in a pew. Social distancing also applies to the line that is formed to receive Holy Communion. Please keep a minimum distance of 6 feet from the person in front of you when approaching the minister.

The Annual Archdiocesan Wedding Anniversary Mass, originally planned for earlier this year, is now scheduled for Saturday, October 17, 2020 at 5:15 PM at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, 18th Street and Benjamin Franklin Parkway, in Philadelphia. Archbishop Pérez is the principal celebrant and homilist. Married couples marking their first, fifth, tenth, twenty-fifth, and fiftieth wedding anniversaries are invited. 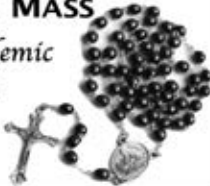
Some may be aware that in addition to being pastor of Sacred Heart Parish, I am also the National Chaplain of the First Catholic Slovak Union, a fraternal benefit society. It was through this position that I was selected to be First Vice President of the Slovak Catholic Federation, an association whereby the four Slovak Catholic fraternal organizations and others work to promote Slovak heritage and the Catholic faith. As First Vice President, I am charged with conducting the Saints Cyril and Methodius Appeal. Now in its 42nd year, this Appeal supports the Pontifical College of Saints Cyril and Methodius in Rome, which is the residence of priests from Slovakia sent to Rome by their bishops for graduate studies. Historically, the annual Appeal was a second collection in Slovak parishes. Since several members of our parish were once members of Our Mother of Sorrows, the Slovak parish of Bridgeport, a second collection will be taken at the Masses next weekend for the Saints Cyril and Methodius Appeal. The collection is next weekend is because next Tuesday is September 15, the Memorial of Our Mother of Sorrows, the Patroness of Slovakia.

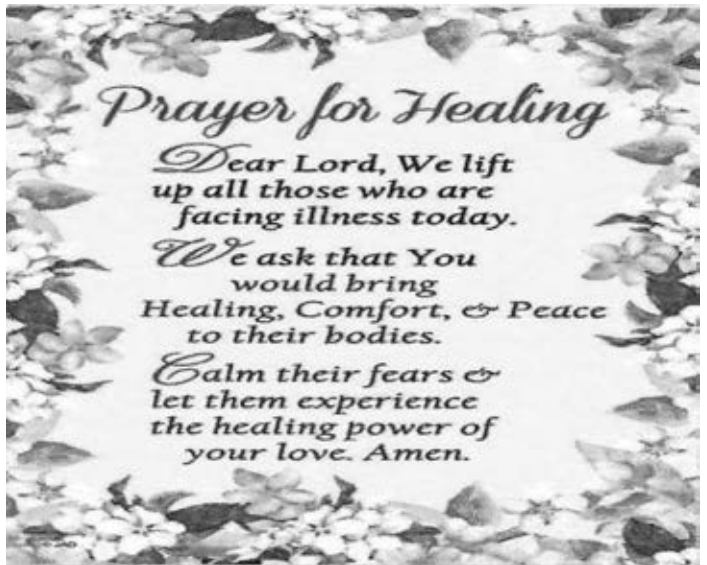

Faith Formation

The Pastoral Constitution of the Church in the Modern World (*Gaudium et spes*) is the last of 16 documents from the Second Vatican Council. Promulgated by Pope Saint Paul VI on December 7, 1965 and addressed to all humanity, *Gaudium et spes* focuses on the human person itself, whole and entire, body and soul, heart and conscience, mind and will. This is the ninth of an eleven-part summary.

It helps to recall the world of the 1960's for a context that helped formulate the teachings on war and peace that are found in this Pastoral Constitution. Several parts of the world at that time were engaged in war either to escape colonialism or to prevent the spread of Communism. The Cuban Missile Crisis in October 1962 which almost led to a nuclear war was fresh in everyone's mind. Also, one cannot forget that a great majority of Council attendees were affected by the Second World War; they remembered well the Holocaust, the effects of the atomic bomb, and other tragedies of war.

All Christians are to cooperate with all humanity to bring about a peace based on justice and love, and to set up the instruments of peace. Peace is neither the absence of war, nor the keeping a balance of power between enemies. It is, rather, a work of justice that must be constantly built up because it is never attained once and for all. Earthly peace has its roots in Christ's commandment of love of neighbor. Necessary requirements for the establishment of peace include a firm determination to respect others and their dignity, as well as the practice of brotherhood.

The Constitution appeals to the universal binding force of natural law and its timeless principles, which are given voice through the human conscience, as a means to end acts of war and the use of modern weaponry. Actions in and of themselves that deliberately violate the human conscience and orders given to commit these actions are criminal. There is no excuse for blind obedience. The methodical extermination of an entire people, nation or ethnic minority must be vehemently condemned as horrendous crimes. People who fearlessly and openly resist carrying out orders to do this possess a courage that merits supreme commendation.

International agreements aimed at making military activity and its consequences less inhuman, as well as stipulations dealing with the treatment of wounded soldiers and prisoners, must be honored. It seems right for laws to make humane provisions for people who conscientiously object bearing arms to carry out public service in another fashion.

Undertaking military action for the just defense of people is one thing, the conquest of other nations is something else.
