Meeting Minutes

The Fairwood Crime Prevention and Improvement District (“District”) held a meeting at Fairwood Branch Library, Thursday January 19, 2023.

The meeting was called to order by Chair, Scott Giurintano at 6:31 pm.

Approval of Minutes

Motion was made by Melanie Sims and seconded by Pat Cormier to accept the minutes from the December 15, meeting.

The motion passed unanimously.

Treasury Report

Expenditures for the past month totaled \$829.50. This includes payment for lawn services. Payments received totaled \$29,861.07 for parcel fees. The current balance is \$36,605.75.

Motion was made by Pat Cormier and seconded by Lloyd Gavion to approve the report. The motion passed unanimously.

Flock Security Cameras

Between December 21, 2022, and January 19, 2023, there were 174,273 license plates read. The highest daily reading was on Thursday, December 22, 2022, with 7,270 plates read.

There were 30 users of the system – 13 by the EBR Sheriff's Office and 17 by BR Police Department.

Status on three new Flock Security Cameras:

Permit was issued January 10, 2023, for a camera at Queen Cathy Dr.

Site survey was performed January 19, 2023, for a camera at Pecan Ridge Ave.

Installation is scheduled January 25, 2023, for a camera at Maple Ridge Ave.

Security Patrols

In December, there were 24 hours of security patrol. The time was spread over eight days, with times ranging from 1:00 pm to 10:15 pm. During that time, citations were written for 12 stop sign violations.

There was a suggestion from a resident in attendance to have our security officer attend a CPID meeting. Pat Cormier will make the request to our security officer.

Security Incidents in the District

Between December 1 and December 31, 2022, there were 27 calls for assistance. This included three hang up calls, one 24A Traumatic Injury P3 call, 12 alarm calls, three calls for disturbance, one call for Follow Up/Investigation, one call for improper telephone communication, one call for a missing adult, one call for noise complaint, one call for a Non-Crime Incident, and three calls for Suspicious Incident/Person/Vehicle.
