Approval of Minutes

Motion was made by Scott Giurintano and seconded by Lloyd Gavion to accept the minutes from the November 17, 2022, meeting.

The motion passed unanimously.

Treasury Report

Expenditures for the past month totaled \$1,879.50. This includes payments for lawn services, security patrol, and the CPID Post Office Box. Payments received totaled \$3.30 from EBRPSO. The current balance is \$8,712.79.

Motion was made by Joanne Cowgill and seconded by Lloyd Gavion to approve the report. The motion passed unanimously.

Flock Security Cameras

Between November 11 and December 14, 2022, there were 283,443 license plates read. The highest daily reading was on Monday, December 12, 2022, with 8,149 plates read.

There were 21 users of the system – seven by the EBR Sheriff's Office and 14 by BR Police Department.

Security Patrols

In November, there were 24 hours of security patrol. The time was spread over nine days, with times ranging from 2:00 pm to 1:30 am. During that time, citations were written for 14 stop sign violations and four parking violation.

Security Incidents in the District

Between November 1 and November 30, 2022, there were 20 calls for assistance. This included one 911 hang up, nine alarm calls, one call for follow up/investigation, one call for improper telephone communication, two calls for missing adult, one call for missing juvenile, one call for neighborhood patrol, two call for non-crime incidents, and two calls for suspicious incidents/persons/vehicles.

Neighborhood Watch Committee

Thomas Shuff, committee chair, advised that the committee is continuing to work on a map of locations of private security cameras.

Chair, Scott Giurintano, made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:21 pm. Joanne Cowgill seconded the motion.
