Call To Order

Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Pat Cormier and seconded by Scott Giurintano to approve the minutes from the meeting held on November 20, 2025. The motion passed unanimously.

Appointment of Commissioners

Fairwood Estates Homeowners Association reappointed Scott Giurintano to serve on the Fairwood Crime Prevention and Improvement District Board for a four-year term. He was sworn in on January 13, 2026.

House of Representative Vanessa Coston LaFleur appointed Cheryl Wilks to serve a four-year term. Cheryl Wilks will be sworn in prior to the next Board meeting.

Treasurer's Report

The total expenses for the District since the November 20, 2025, meeting, total \$3,081.60. This amount included \$1,650.00 for lawn maintenance, \$1,190.00 for security patrol, \$226.00 for P.O. Box renewals, and \$15.60 for stamps.

The year-end balance for 2025 was \$1,335.10. This amount is more than anticipated in the proposed 2026 budget because the security officer worked fewer hours in December.

The District received \$40,363.64 in parcel fees from the EBR Sheriff's Office on January 15, 2026. The current balance is \$41,698.74.

The District will pay for lawn maintenance by the cut instead of monthly.

A motion was made by Scott Giurintano and seconded by Pat Cormier to approve the Treasurer's report. The motion passed unanimously.

Flock Security Cameras- November 2025

During November 2025, there were a total of 171,273 license plates read. South Flannery Road at Old Hammond Hwy had the highest volume with a total of 74,501 vehicles and Pecan Ridge had the lowest volume with a total of 1,568 vehicles.

Flock Security Cameras- December 2025

During December 2025, there were a total of 175,032 license plates read. South Flannery Road at Old Hammond Hwy had the highest volume with a total of 75,549 vehicles (43% of total) and Pecan Ridge had the lowest volume with a total of 1,742 vehicles (0.9% of total).

Security Patrols- November 2025

During November 2025, the officer worked a total of 20 hours patrolling every 6 days with times ranging from 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. He issued 7 stop sign citations.

Security Patrols- December 2025

During December 2025, the officer worked a total of 14 hours patrolling every 7.8 days with times ranging from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. He issued 4 stop sign citations.

Security Incidents- November 2025

For November 2025, the following security incidents were noted on Open Neighborhood BR: 1 damage to property, 2 possessions of stolen things, 1 theft, 1 simple criminal damage, 1 vice, 1 extortion, 1 nuisance, and 1 suspicious incident. There were 15 calls placed to 311.

Security Incidents- December 2025

For December 2025, the following incidents were noted on Open Neighborhood BR: 2 thefts, 1 simple burglary, 1 residential burglary, 3 suspicious incidents, 1 nuisance, and 1 deceased person. There were 21 calls placed to 311.

Mobile Cameras

Scott Giurintano said Ring is supposed to release a mobile security trailer in the spring 2026. The cost for the mobile camera is about \$5,000.00. The mobile camera uses AI and talks.
