

# BIBLE READING PLAN

FOR THE WEEK OF September 20, 2020

As you read through the Song of Solomon (Song of Songs), try to look past the imagery and consider how this song of love applies to God's relationship with His people – first for the nation of Israel, then for the Church in New Testament times. Then consider what the point is for this book to be included into our Bible.

**FRIDAY – Isaiah 1**

What are some of the analogies Isaiah uses for God's people Israel? What do these word pictures say about the heart of God's people? Which ones surprise you? Has there been a time in your life when you felt disciplined by the Lord? Did that lead you back to Him, or drive you away from Him?

**SATURDAY – Isaiah 2**

What do you think "in the last days" means in this chapter? What is the "mountain of the Lord"? Are there other passages in the Bible where this phrase is used? If so, what does the term apply to in scripture? What is the "day of the Lord"? As you read verses 12-18, is this a day you personally are looking forward to? Why or why not? What is Isaiah's conclusion, according to verse 22?
