

# BIBLE READING PLAN

FOR THE WEEK OF September 27, 2020

## **MONDAY – Isaiah 3**

Why would we find God bringing judgment against His OWN people in this book, rather than upon His enemies? What seems to be the nature of the kinds of judgment that will take place in the land? Compare this to Romans 1:24-32.

## **TUESDAY – Isaiah 4**

What is promised in this chapter? Why is this significant, in your opinion?

## **WEDNESDAY – Isaiah 5**

What is this song portraying? Who is the loved one? What is the vineyard? What happened to the vineyard? Who is being judged in this chapter? Why? How will the punishment be played out?

## **THURSDAY – Isaiah 6**

What is special about Isaiah's commission in this chapter? What is the significance of coal? What does God send Isaiah out to do? What makes the difference between Isaiah's words in verse 5 and his words in verse 8?

## **FRIDAY – Isaiah 7**

What is the situation surrounding the prophecy of the "virgin birth?" When Ahaz states he will not ask for a sign from the Lord, do you think he is being noble and righteous? Why or why not? Look specifically at verse 14; is this a message that brings hope to Ahaz – news that the two nations he fears will be "laid to waste?" If you look at the very next verse, how can you tell that the Lord did NOT intend for the news to be good news for Ahaz?

## **SATURDAY – Isaiah 8**

Which nation will be used by God to discipline His people Israel? What does the Lord tell Isaiah to NOT do? What is God trying to tell Isaiah in verses 12-13? Are there times when God brings about judgment, but people just see it as just a happenstance, an earthly, physical event – and miss the spiritual nature of it all? What does Isaiah say the people will do in light of the painful things they are to go through?
