## Love an Inmate Through the Glass!

Did you know that the most effective way we have found to give an inmate hope and possibly change their life is simply to show them you care about them and are praying for them?

When someone from church visits a person in jail it makes a HUGE impression. They feel abandoned and isolated from life, so just your showing up is a blessing and a surprise. They don't get many visits because it takes the love of Christ to break through the hurt and shame of prison. So take the opportunity to visit them "thru the glass". It will give them hope and nourish your soul!

#### Here is how you go about visiting someone in the Lehigh County Jail:

- 1. Call the officer in the jail lobby (610-782-3270), give the first, middle and last name of the inmate and ask for the days you can visit.
- 2. On the visit day park in the 4<sup>th</sup> & Hamilton st. garage next to the jail.
- 3. In the jail front lobby hand the officer your driver's license or other photo I.D. and ask to visit the inmate.
- 4. If you came on the wrong day, or if the inmate has already had a visitor or does not accept your visit (they don't know you, are sick, etc.) you will be denied. Don't let it bother you and come back. Don't give up!
- 5. Take the token from the officer and put all your valuables in a locker.
- 6. Take a seat and wait for the inmate's name, floor number and seat number to be called. Then walk thru the metal detector to the elevator.
- 7. Go to the floor and sit in your seat number next to the glass window.
- 8. Wait until the inmate comes to the glass and pick up the phone.
- 9. You will have 30 minutes to talk. Let them know you're not ashamed of them and that people are praying for them and love them.

### We Are Making A Difference!

I met Mark, an inmate in jail for many D.U.I's. He was very discouraged from being in and out of jail. I met with him and prayed with him as well as reading scripture and going over Bible studies. Today, he is working at a restaurant in Florida as a server and just got married without ever touching alcohol. Only through the power of God can people such as Mark conquer their demons and succeed in life. It truly is an honor to give of myself to these men and to pray for them, along with their families. I am humbled. (*Yokefellow Volunteer, men*)

Praise God if you don't have a Son, Daughter, Mother or Father in jail. If a loved one was in jail wouldn't you want someone to help them? You could be the one to make a difference in someone's life. When we met Jen in jail many years ago she shook badly from drugs. Praise God that today she is on her own with four children. It was a long hard road, but remember that one soul is worth more than the whole world. Every soul we meet is going to spend eternity in one of two places. Please help someone get to the right place. Eternity is a long time to be in the wrong place. (Husband and Wife Yokefellow Volunteers)

The inmates are constantly very appreciative of the Bible we provided for them and our time spent to visit them. Some of them have shown spiritual growth or a renewal of faith. I would say Yokefellowship benefited the inmates and also us, the volunteers. (Yokefellow volunteer, women)

John came to our Bible study regularly and after release from jail we fished and laughed together and talked about Christ. I lost contact with John but two years later he showed up in jail with multiple charges. This time his attitude changed and he cried out to the Lord to save him and forgive him. He remebered Yokefellow and is coming to our meetings. John is excited about his faith and telling others about Christ. He is a tough guy, fending for himself since childhood. He said he can talk to murderers, rapists, thieves and dangerous gang members on the inside, where we can't. God is using him to break up hard soil. Praise God! (Yokefellow volunteer, men)

The women thank the volunteers for coming and not being judgmental. They say how much they enjoy the Bible studies and life application discussions. The ladies tell of answered prayer and mended relationships that our visits encourage. (Yokefellow Volunteer, Women)

The inmates are so thankful for the volunteers who show up every week to not only do Bible study but who care enough to listen to their life struggles and pray with them for jobs, housing, healed relationships. (*Volunteers for men*).

- C.E. is a 28 year old inmate who has spent half of his life incarcerated. Now he has continued contact with a Yokefellow volunteer. He is excited about being in a dog training program and is learning skills for a business he plans on starting when released from SCI Coal Township. (Yokefellow volunteer, men,)
- H.H., an inmate in SCI Forest, says he is thankful for 5+ years contact with a Yokefellow volunteer who keeps him grounded through letters, phone calls, and prayers for safety due to violence in prison. (Yokefellow volunteer, men)
- A.R., an inmate in SCI Retreat, says he is thankful for volunteers believing in him because sometimes within this dark place it feels as if no one remembers me. Thanks for writing" (Yokefellow volunteer, men)
