Entries, Contestant Pay-out and Points Award



The rodeo is open to all youth. Age of the contestant for the purpose of placing in the divisions shall be their age on the day of the rodeo. The contestant shall provide a photo-copy of their birth certificate, the completed Waiver of Liability form, completed entry form, and full payment upon signing up to compete in the rodeo.

If an event has only one entry, then that event will be removed and not be part of the rodeo, and the contestant entered as the single entry will be reimbursed the full amount of their entry fees. If entered in other events, the contestant can compete in those events. The determination on when the event will be removed, on account of only one entry, will be June 16th.

Each contestant shall pay a one-time rodeo fee of \$25, plus pay the entry fee for each event they will compete in.

Events, Pay Out and Point System for All Around awards & High Point award

Entries, Contestant Pay-out and Points Award



All entry fees and added money (for the events which have them) in each event shall be paid out according the schedule listed. No monies shall be deducted on the event pay-outs.

Number of entries	Pay-out, money percentage and number of places
2-3	Jackpot (100%)
4-6	2 places (60%, 40%)
7-10	3 places (50%, 30%, 20%)
11-15	4 places (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%)
16-20	5 places (35%, 27%, 19%, 12%, 7%)
21 or more	6 places (29%, 24%, 19%, 14%, 9%, 5%)

Should there be a tie in an event, monies for each of the places will be totaled and split equally.

For example;

if there are 3 ties for 2nd place in an event,

Payout for 2nd, 3rd, and 4th will be totaled, then divided by 3,

and this amount will be paid to each contestant who have tied.

Ground Money

In the event where there are not enough qualified contestants to make a complete pay-out, then the remaining places not paid out shall be deemed ground money. The ground money will be totaled and paid equally to each of the contestants who have qualified scores or times. If there are no qualified scores or times in an event, then all entries plus added money (if any) will be paid equally to each contestant who have entered.

Points will be used to determine the All-Around winner in each of the five divisions and for the High Point winner in the rodeo. Division all around winners will receive buckles and the High Point winner will receive the saddle.

If there should be tie for any of the awards, the winner will be determined by the flip of a coin. A designated Rodeo Committee member will flip the coin in presence the contestants who have the tie.

For the high point saddle award, each contestant shall mark on their entry form the three events which they declare will be used to earn points. The point total from the three events will be used to determine the high point winner.

The points awarded for each event shall as shown below:

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1st Place - 23 points
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2nd Place - 19 points

3rd Place - 16 points

4th Place - 13 points

5th Place - 11 points

6th Place - 9 points

7th Place - 7 points

8th Place - 5 points

9th Place - 3 points

10th Place - 2 points

Entries, Contestant Pay-out and Points Award



In each of the rodeo events, if there is a tie between two or more contestants or a split of two or more places, then the points will be added together and divided equally among the number of contestants in a tie or split.

For example: two contestants tie for first place in an event, points awarded for first and second place are added together then divided between two contestants.

First Place – 23 points Second Place - 19 points

Total of 42 points $\div 2 = 21$ points per contestant
