Work together to build the tallest standing tower possible.

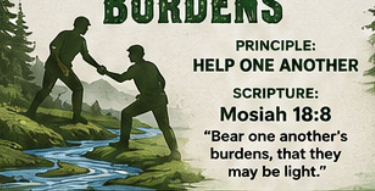
- The tower must stand on its own.

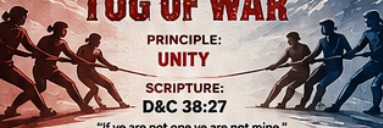
