The time it takes to become a licensed driver depends on whether you choose to learn the All-London Knowledge or a Suburban sector. To apply for a licence, you will need to meet the following criteria: You must be at least 18 years old at the time of applying (although you cannot be licensed until you are 21 years old). There is no upper age limit, as long as you meet the other licensing requirements. You must hold a full DVLA, Northern Ireland, or other European Economic Area state driving licence. You must have the right to live and work in the UK. You must meet our character and medical requirements. Character requirements You must be of good character. To establish this, you will be required to undertake an 'enhanced' criminal records check from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) through our authorised service provider. Your original DBS certificate must meet TfL's strict criteria to be accepted for a licence application, including the declaration of any variations of identity that may appear on official ID documents. Please see the guidance document on ensuring your DBS application is completed correctly. The Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) has an online subscription service that lets applicants keep their DBS certificates up to date. Medical requirements You must be medically fit which means meeting the DVLA Group 2 medical standards. In most cases, this will mean that you will have to undergo a medical examination with someone who has access to your full medical history. From 4 April 2022, HMRC introduced new tax checks for all taxi and private hire drivers, as well as PHV operators. As a licensed driver, you should be registered to pay any tax that may be due on income you earn from your licensed trade. You will need to complete a tax check with HMRC (using your GOV.UK Government Gateway ID and password). [dejayogirimo](#) You must then obtain a unique 9-character tax check code which confirms your registration to pay tax. The tax check code will then need to be provided to TfL as part of your application to renew your licence. Guidance is available on GOV.UK to help you complete the tax check. Please note: You will need to ensure that you provide the correct tax check code for the type of licence that is being applied for, i.e. a taxi or private hire driver's licence. A tax check code is only valid for 12 days from when it is obtained from HMRC. Please bear this in mind when submitting your application. Please ensure that you record the tax check code clearly and correctly on your application form. Should a tax check code be required, but it is not provided, then your application will be deemed to be incomplete.

If you're a disabled person and interested in becoming a driver, there are some things to consider. Try to ensure that everyone has an equal opportunity to get through the application and assessment process. However, there are some medical conditions that, for public safety reasons, will mean you can't be licensed, so it is important that you discuss your situation with your GP before you apply. For full information on medical guidelines please refer to the DVLA Group 2 guidelines.

Some licensed taxis and private hire vehicles have modifications made to them to enable people to drive them. Vehicle adaptations include: Steering wheel ball Hand-operated braking controls Hand-operated accelerator controls Reconfigured foot pedal controls Infra-red control panel for operating vehicle lights, indicators and horn. Drivers who use vehicle adaptations will need to be assessed by a medical professional and driver assessor. They will recommend what adaptations are needed and exactly what equipment must be fitted to ensure the driver has full control of the vehicle at all times. The recommended adaptations and equipment must be fitted by an authorised mobility installer. Documentary evidence that the installer is authorised is required. [pabufujavo](#) Before you have any equipment fitted or adaptations made to your vehicle, you should first contact our licensing team. Convictions and exemptions Disclosure and Barring service check If you have completed a enhanced disclosure including both barred lists under the workforce code of 'Other' in a relevant occupation, in the last four months, you are exempt from requiring a further check. Medical Applicants are exempt from completing a medical form as part of their application if they: Hold a DVLA Group 2 licence (full or a provisional licence issued since January 1998) Have an active application with us, have completed our medical and are under the age of 45 Active applicants or existing licensees must have a medical exam if over the age of 45 and the last medical was done more than three years ago, or you're subject to providing an age-related medical. To apply for any of the above exemptions email us at tph.enquiries@tfl.gov.uk stating the exemption you want to apply for. We will email you the correct form. Convictions If you have any of the following convictions, it's unlikely that your application will be successful. [cuselu](#) Before submitting an application, please consider: Any conviction for a major violent offence (murder, manslaughter etc) Whether you have more than one conviction of any type of violent offence in the last 10 years If you are still serving a custodial sentence, even if you have been released early on licence or the sentence was suspended. If you have been convicted, cautioned or subjected to any other penalty for a serious sexual offence (rape, indecent assault, trafficking, possession of indecent images etc) Whether you have been convicted, cautioned or subjected to any other penalty for more than one sexual offence of any type, irrespective of age. Whether you are listed on either the Children's or Adults' barred list. If you have been convicted, cautioned or subjected to any other penalty for touting in the last 12 months or have more than one penalty for touting in the last five years. This is not an exhaustive list, licensing decisions are made on a case by case basis. Policies, advice and guidance on licensing taxi and private hire drivers in London. Taxi and Private Hire Driver Policy Under the Equality Act 2010, drivers of Hackney carriage and private hire vehicles have a legal obligation to carry passengers and assistance dogs and disabled persons. When carrying these passengers, drivers cannot charge any more than the metered fare; must allow the assistance dog to remain with the passenger and afford all reasonable assistance. The term "assistance dogs" refer to more than just guide dogs for blind people. It includes: Guide dogs for the blind - white harness with yellow fluorescent strips Hearing dogs for the deaf - burgundy jacket Dogs for the disabled (seven years to adult) - yellow jacket Dogs for the disabled (to work with children) - blue harness Canine partners (people with physical impairments) - purple jacket Support dogs (physical and other impairments) - blue jacket Under the Act, it is an offence for any operator or driver to refuse to carry assistance dogs. On conviction for such an offence, drivers can be fined up to £1,000. Where a driver has an allergy to dogs, the driver must apply for an exemption from carrying assistance dogs.

To apply for an exemption, a driver must fill in an Exemption application form [PDF, 41Kb]. If no exemption has been applied for and subsequently granted, then drivers are still required to carry assistance dogs.

Where an application is made to us for an exemption, it must be supported by medical evidence. The driver with the allergy should be under the care of a specialist consultant and will be required to produce reports from their consultant. Mobility Assistance The Equality Act 2010 places duties on drivers when carrying disabled passengers. Drivers must carry the passenger, carry the wheelchair or mobility aids they have, take reasonable steps to ensure they are safe and comfortable, provide mobility assistance and take reasonable steps to help the passenger identify and find the vehicle. Drivers must also not make, or propose to make, any additional charge for the above. Mobility assistance includes to enable the passenger to get into or out of the vehicle, and to load the passenger's luggage, wheelchair, or mobility aids into or out of the vehicle. Where a driver has medical grounds or a physical condition that makes it impossible or unreasonably difficult to perform this mobility assistance, they must apply for an exemption from carrying assistance dogs. The driver must provide evidence of the medical grounds or physical condition. If the driver has a medical condition that makes it impossible or unreasonably difficult to perform mobility assistance, they must apply for an exemption from carrying assistance dogs.
