Working the UK abroad form Before you can start learning the Knowledge, you need to apply to be a licensed taxi driver and have your application approved. The time takes to become a licensed driver depends on whether you choose to learn the London Knowledge or a Suburban sector. To apply for a licence, you will need to meet the following criteria: You must be at least 18 years old at the time of applying (although you cannot be licensed until you are 21 years old). There is no upper limit on age. You must be a resident of the United Kingdom. You must meet our character and medical requirements. Character requirements You must be of good character. You must be able to establish that you will be required to undertake an 'enhanced' criminal records check from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) through our authorised service provider. Your original DBS certificate must meet TFL's strict criteria to be accepted for a licence application, including the declaration of any variations of identity that may appear on official I.D. documents. Please see the guidance document on ensuring your DBS application is completed correctly: The Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) has an online subscription service that lets applicants keep their DBS certificates up to date. Medical requirements You must be medically fit which means meeting the DVLA Group 2 medical standards. In most cases, this will mean that you will have to undergo a medical examination with someone who has access to your full medical history. From 4 April 2012, HMRC introduced new tax checks for all taxi and private hire drivers, as well as PHV operators. As a licensed driver, you should be registered to pay any tax that may be due on income you earn from your licensed trade. You will need to complete a tax check with HMRC (using your GOV.UK Government Gateway ID and password). [Tax check](#) You must then obtain a unique 9-character tax check code which confirms your registration to pay tax. The tax check code will then need to be provided to TFL as part of your application to renew your licence. Guidance is available on GOV.UK to help you complete the tax check. Please note: You will need to ensure you provide the correct tax check code for the type of licence that is being applied for, i.e. a taxi or private hire driver's licence A tax check code is only valid for 120 days from when it is obtained from HMRC. If you're a disabled person and interested in becoming a driver, there are some things to consider. We try to ensure that everyone has an equal opportunity to get through the application and assessment process. However, there are some medical conditions that, for public safety reasons, will mean you can't be licensed, so it is important that you discuss your situation with your GP before you apply. For full information on medical guidelines please refer to the DVLA Group 2 guidelines. [Medical guidelines](#) Some adaptations to vehicle controls may be needed. Vehicle adaptations for wheelchair users Drivers with physical impairments may require adaptations to the vehicle. These include hand-operated accelerator controls, infra-red control pads for operating vehicle lights, indicators and horn. Any vehicle adaptations will need to be assessed by a medical professional and driver assessor. They will recommend what adaptations are needed and exactly what equipment must be fitted to ensure the driver has full control of the vehicle at all times. Convictions and exemptions Disclosure and Barring service check If you have completed an enhanced disclosure including both barred lists under the category of 'Other' in a relevant occupation, in the last four months, you are exempt for requiring a further check. Medical Applicants are exempt from completing a medical form as part of their application if they: Hold a DVLA Group 2 licence (full or a provisional licence issued since January 1998) Have an active application with us, have completed our medical and are under the age of 45 Active applicants or existing licensees must have a medical exam if over the age of 45 and the last medical was done more than three years ago, or you're subject to providing an age-related medical. Convictions If you have any of the following convictions, it's unlikely that your application will be successful. Policies, advice and guidance on licensing taxi and private hire drivers in London. Taxi and Private Hire Driver Policy Under the Equality Act 2010, drivers of Hackney carriage and private hire vehicles have a legal obligation to carry passengers and transport disabled people. When carrying these passengers, drivers cannot charge any more than the metered fare; must allow the assistance dog to remain with the passenger and afford all reasonable assistance. The term "assistance dogs" refers to more than just guide dogs for blind people. It includes: Guide dogs for the blind - white cane assistance dogs Hearing dogs for the deaf - burgundy jacket Dogs for the disabled (seven years to adult) - yellow jacket Dogs for the disabled (to work with children) - blue harmless canine partners (people with physical impairments) - purple jacket Support dogs (physical and other impairments) - blue jacket. Under the Act, it is an offence for any operator or driver to refuse to carry assistance dogs. On conviction for such an offence, drivers can be fined up to £1,000. Where a driver has an allergy to dogs, the driver must apply for an exemption from carrying assistance dogs. [Exemptions](#) To apply for an exemption, a driver must fill in an Exemption application form (PDF, 41Kb). If no exemption has been applied for and subsequently granted, then drivers are still required to carry assistance dogs.

Where an application is made to us for an exemption, it must be supported by medical evidence. The driver with the allergy should consult and will be required to produce reports from their consultant. Mobility Assistance The Equality Act 2010 places duties on drivers when carrying disabled passengers. [Mobility assistance](#) Drivers must take steps to enable passengers to travel safely and comfortably. Drivers must also not make, or propose to make, any additional charges for the above. Mobility assistance includes: Providing a wheelchair or mobility aids to enable passengers to enter and exit the vehicle. Where drivers have medical grounds or a physical condition that makes it impossible or unreasonably difficult to perform this mobility assistance, they must apply for an exemption from carrying passengers. [Exemptions](#) Drivers must also take steps to enable the passenger's luggage, wheelchair, mobility aids into or out of the vehicle. Where drivers have medical grounds or a physical condition that makes it impossible or unreasonably difficult to perform this mobility assistance, they must apply for an exemption from carrying passengers. [Exemptions](#) To apply for an exemption, drivers must complete and submit a Mobility Assistance Exemption Application Form (PDF, 120KB). An exemption only applies to the mobility assistance duties, and not to any other duties. If no exemption has been applied for and subsequently granted, then drivers are still required to provide mobility assistance. Where an application is made to us for an exemption, it must be supported by medical evidence. The driver would be expected to be under the care of a specialist consultant and will be required to produce reports from their consultant in the first instance.
