



Back By Popular Demand!

Many of you have asked to see a breakdown of the steps involved with my painting process again. I did this some time last year and it went over very well! Please see below for descriptions and the finished piece.



Step 1: I use a charcoal stick to layout the composition. It's a rough sketch outlining the basic shapes and placement on the canvas.



Step 2: This is a burnt sienna stain that "kills the white". There are two reasons for this step: it allows me to see more contrast between the lights and darks and it also creates a rich undertone for layering.





Step 3: This is my "color map" where I do a light wash laying out my basic colors. Now I start adding detail and layering the paint. This is also where I aim for dramatic contrasts, pulling out the lights and darks.

Step 5: More layering and adding detail. Still working toward intense lights and darks. This is the stage where I try to invite the viewer into the scene by capturing the feeling of the piece. See below for the finished painting!

Sometimes people say just the right thing at the right time and it can impact your whole life. A few years ago, I was trying to decide next steps for my future and someone said very helpful words to me. I was working a demanding job and spent many hours daydreaming about painting again. I missed being an artist and often felt trapped by my life. I could always count on Mare to be direct with me, especially when I felt stuck. She unwaveringly said there is no "if", no "down the road", no "maybe." Instead, she told me to act as if my life had already changed in the direction I wanted and to just keep walking that walk. After a short time, my daydreams turned into active steps until I finally took one giant leap and guit my full-time job.

And here I am doing exactly what I want to do, making a living at what I love most! I wanted to paint something that reminded me of Mare: a simple flower piece with crisp, clear imagery and a peaceful feeling.
