"People don't want to live with things that disturb them They want to feel some kind of connection to what they're looking at and how they want to feel. They often tell me, 'I feel very peaceful and happy and that's why I want this painting."

Cooley was born in Nantucket Cottage Hospital but has lived most of her life in Sarasota. "My dad was an artist forever in Nantucket and I would always paint with him and draw with him from the time I was 5 years old," she said. "It's really in my blood."

Cooley attended Ringling College of Art & Design in Sarasota and graduated with a bachelor's. Since then she painted murals, called Whimsical Walls, while her kids were in school. Then she had a little gallery in Sarasota which was fun for a while. But now she is doing just the outdoor art festivals which she describes as the most fun and

rewarding because she enjoys the camaraderie with other artists and developing a rapport with the people that put on the events.

"I call this my mobile gallery," she said.

"My husband is retired and he is behind the scenes. I couldn't do this without him. We do this together. He takes care of loading the van, putting up the tent, making sure we have everything secure. It's definitely a two-person

operation but I do love it – the energy of it."

Coastal paintings, flowers and pet portraits make her feel happy. She loves dogs and cats and she has great compassion for people who lose an animal. Usually she does the pet portraits on small canvases working from a few photos so she can capture their personalities.


