Anti-Human Trafficking Awareness Month

Co-Founder Sarah Hollis, LCAS, LCMHC joined the Western North Carolina Anti-Human Trafficking Coalition Team for the first meeting and training session of 2023. We now have received more training about the trafficking type of Patient Brokering, and our MMF team will be part of the solution to ensure that when we refer and pay for services, especially related to substance abuse treatment, the women we are supporting encounter safe and expert services. MMF will also be joining the WNC Rapid Response Team, which ensures women with emergency needs specific to trafficking will have the wrap-around services needed in that crucial moment of leaving trafficking. This is a team that will support local agencies if they face a funding depletion and in that moment would have to turn a woman away. Sarah also enjoyed meeting new agencies and providers who share a similar passion for ending the cycle of trauma at the Human Trafficking Awareness Expert Panel. MMF will continue to increase our trusted referral database by getting to know these providers in the local community.

ONE WOMAN AT A TIME FROM START TO FREEDOM

The growing number of peer-reviewed research data shows that the number of traumatic experiences in childhood directly correlates to the likelihood of being victimized again in adulthood. For example, a girl who experiences 4 separate traumatic experiences is 6.04 times more likely to be sexually victimized as an adult compared to someone without these adverse childhood experiences.

There is a growing conversation within our communities of how to deal with significant social issues like homelessness, foster care, crime, domestic violence, unemployment and healthcare costs. Mercy Mountain Foundation believes that one of the several important solutions to these social concerns is access to high-quality long-term treatment. High-quality therapeutic treatment helps provide women with a real solution and minimizes the threat of being victimized again so they can live free in our communities. This is our Mission.

And, so all the donations received in 2023 will be going directly to our scholarship fund. Each scholarship recipient will receive high quality and evidence-based treatment intervention to create an intensive care plan to help them engage life in new ways. The highest quality of care will be provided through her entire journey of healing and independence. Mercy Mountain Foundation began with this vision in mind: for a person, who for so long has thought the power and privilege to end repetitive traumatic situations to be inaccessible, will now find healing and freedom. We seek for freedom to include not only the emotional freedom from the past, but financial and relational freedom as well.
