#### THANKSGIVING PARADES

Thanksgiving Day parades have become a fun tradition in America, with large parades happening in big cities like Chicago, Philadelphia, Detroit, New Orleans, and more.

But by far the biggest and most popular is the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City. The very first Macy's parade was in 1924, which means it has been going on for 100 years now! The parade was postponed for a few years during World War II and didn't run from 1942–1944.

The first parade was dreamed up by Macy's employees as a festive way to celebrate the holiday season and draw more people to shop in their store. The first parade route ran from Harlem to the Macy's store at 34th Street and Broadway. The well-known route today runs for 2.5 miles from Central Park West to Macy's Herald Square.

It was televised for the first time in 1939 which is what helped make this parade so popular. Now, every year on Thanksgiving morning, families across the U.S. turn on their TVs to watch the iconic parade of giant character balloons, musical acts, and marching bands parade through the streets of New York City. In the 2022 parade, our own Bourbon County High School (northeast of Lexington) marching band performed!

It goes on rain or shine, so the people who have gathered to watch along the parade route, plus the performers in the parade, might be enjoying a beautiful late November morning, or they might be trying not to look miserable as they are freezing cold and wet!
