#### WHAT'S GOING ON AT ASBURY UNIV?

Some of you may have heard about unusual meetings that are happening in Wilmore – a small town just south of Lexington. The word "revival" is being used to describe the events of the past two weeks, and you may wonder what that word means, and be curious about what is happening. So, we thought it would be a good idea to offer an explanation to clarify it as best as we can.

The people who follow Jesus meet together regularly for fellowship and for worship.

Normally, this happens in regularly scheduled and planned gatherings that we call church - We sing, pray, learn from the Bible, and have fellowship with one another. These gatherings occur at least weekly, usually on Sundays, but can also occur anytime Christians want to gather together, and any place that is available for that gathering. In general, whenever Christians get together, the same elements are there - worship, prayer, study of God's Word, and fellowship.

At various times in history, God has also moved in a different way - more unexpected and unplanned. Two weeks ago, after the regular chapel service at Asbury University (a small, Christian college in Wilmore), some students remained after the end of the service to pray to God, sing in worship, and confess their sins. Unexpectedly, more students returned to the chapel and joined them, and then many others from the university felt drawn into that chapel space as well during the remainder of the day and evening.

The intensity of God's presence is particularly felt and experienced, and many people are finding healing from needs in their lives and their hearts. Most of all, many people are being reminded of God's great love for them, and His presence with them in the midst of whatever they are facing in their lives.
