SPRING FORWARD

DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME BEGINS AT 2AM ON MARCH 12, 2023

Each spring most of the United States moves their clocks forward one hour at the start of Daylight Saving Time (also referred to as "Spring Forward").

Why do we do this? Some say it began to help farmers have more daylight in warm summer months, while others say it started to conserve light and energy sources. Recently there have been bills proposed in the government to get rid of the time change altogether, but nothing has been passed yet.

So remember to set your clocks forward one hour before you go to bed this Saturday, March 11th to ensure you are on time to your activities the following day! Most phones, computers and other similar devices will automatically change. Think about clocks like your watch, oven, microwave, in your car, etc.

What does this mean? Sadly, you will lose an hour of sleep Saturday night, unless you go to bed earlier.

After the time change, the sun will rise later in the morning than it has been and it will become dark later in the evening. The good news is this means more daylight in the evenings as the weather grows warmer!


Kid Eat Free (or Cheap!)
