
Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill

From Immanuel Baptist Church, go south on Tates Creek Road.

Take the ramp onto KY-4 W/E New Circle Road and go 3.6 miles.

Take Exit 2 for US 68 W.

Turn left onto US-68 W/Harrodsburg Road.

Continue to follow US-68 W for 21 miles.

The entrance to Shaker Village will be on the right.

Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill is a living history museum. The central village with 34 buildings has many historical interpreters who recreate the Shaker life of the 1850s. You can watch expert crafts people making traditional Shaker products. The Craft Store (built in 1812) contains a large array of handmade items that demonstrate Shaker simplicity and high-quality craftsmanship.

Want some good food? Enjoy a superior meal (breakfast, lunch, or dinner) in the Trustees' Office Dining Room. The menus celebrate Shaker roots while featuring dishes inspired by seasonal ingredients found in the garden right outside the windows and from local farmers.



In addition, visitors can drive, walk, hike, bicycle, or ride horses through the 3,000-acre Nature Preserve. There are 40 miles of trails for all skill levels. Stop for a quiet moment at the main bird viewing area and count how many different birds you see.



You can also stay overnight at The Inn at Shaker Village which includes more than 70 guest rooms, suites, or private cottages spread throughout 13 restored 19th century buildings. Inn accommodations feature Shaker reproduction furniture, hardwood flooring, and private baths.



The Dixie Belle Riverboat offers a 1-hour narrated cruise through the Kentucky River palisades – high cliffs and untouched natural beauty. The boat departs from Shaker Landing a short drive from the actual village.

The Shakers chose a peaceful way of life. A quest for simplicity and perfection is reflected in their fine designs and craftsmanship and today the term Shaker-made is synonymous with excellence around the world.
