TOP U.S. CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

Is this your first Christmas season in the U.S.? Here are some of our favorite Christmas traditions!

Decorating the Christmas Tree: Whether real or artificial, families often make an event out of decorating the tree together.

Advent Calendars: A special countdown to Christmas during December. Each day might have a picture or small candy or gift in a small box. Intended to build anticipation to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

Stockings by the Fireplace: A stocking is hung for each member of the family in that house and filled with small gifts for Christmas morning.

Santa Claus and Gift Giving: Children are often told the legend that Santa travels from the North Pole on Christmas Eve to deliver presents. Santa Clauses appear in stores, malls and festivals where you can get your kids' picture taken with him.

Christmas Carols and Songs: Communities may organize caroling events, and you'll hear Christmas music playing on the radio and in stores.

Holiday Lights Displays: Many homes and businesses decorate with elaborate light displays, inflatables (a new tradition) and Nativity scenes (the scene of Jesus' birth).

Christmas Cookies: People bake and give Christmas cookies and treats throughout December. Recipes are passed down in families, and cookie decorating or cookie exchange parties are held.

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Meals:

Traditional Christmas foods may include roast turkey, ham, mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce, and various desserts like pumpkin pie.

Watching Christmas Movies: Classics like "A Christmas Carol," "It's a Wonderful Life," and newer films like "Home Alone" and "Elf" are big favorites.

Attending Church Services: For Christians celebrating the birth of Jesus, attending a Christmas Eve or Christmas Day church service is an important part of the celebration! Many churches hold special services, including choir concerts and candlelight ceremonies.
