Bailey also captured the Billie Wickliffe Trophy and the Ceil Maclaurin Trophy. The Four Ball at Jekyll challenged us for the first time since 1979 with the cancellation of Four Ball's first day of play. As a result, we had Co-net winners from each course: Indian Mounds - Jane Appling & Barbara Edstrom, Pine Lakes - Joye Marshall & Patricia Smith. Based on player feedback, the Board will review and update all aspects of their action plan for unforeseen weather.

The intent of this collaboration is to create and promote the most important women's amateur golf championship in Georgia and to identify the best female golfer in the state. The new designate for the Georgia Women's State Amateur Champion is **Georgia Women's Amateur Championship conducted by the GWGA and GSGA.**

A priority for the 2019 Board is to increase the funding of our Grant Program. For 2018, we will be delivering/ mailing fifteen \$500 checks to high schools all across Georgia for a total of \$7,500. These grants are not possible without the support and donation of our membership. Our goal for 2019 is \$9,000 in honor of our 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The Grant program financially supports and promotes golf/golfing programs for young female golfers throughout Georgia. These programs qualify as tax-deductible donations 501(c)(3). Thank you for your contributions to these young female golfers.

I would like to thank our retired Board Directors Lynn Mitchell, Renee Garcia, and Becky Yeager for their years of valuable service. Your contributions to GWGA are significant. I would also like to welcome Sissi Gann from Houston Lake CC and Mary Woodfin from Mirror Lake Golf Club as our newest additions to the Board. We look forward to working with you.
