Recently I got a call from the Arizona Head Coach Caitlin Lowe who invited me back to the school. I visited this past weekend, and several premiere players signed early in the day. I went to the Arizona football game later that day and it was then that I committed and notified the other schools of my decision"

Taylor stated the key factors in choosing Arizona included how competitive they were for National Championships and the relationships she built with the coaches. "They really took the time to watch me and get to know me as a person. I really fell in love with the campus and have become friends with several of my future teammates."

Taylor gave thanks to Tracy High Softball Coach Paulette Keeney in her development process. "She has always been so supportive of me and has been flexible with my decision making and helping me get on base. She trusts my game decisions and gives me the latitude to execute my talents."

Taylor hopes to significantly contribute to the 2026 Bulldog softball team that is loaded with talent. "As a Freshman I got a lot of singles. As a Sophomore I generated more RBIs.
