When waste water leaves your home it goes to a wastewater treatment plant

At the treatment plant it goes through three levels of treatment to be clean and safe enough to put back into the Savannah River.

We should all be working to conserve water, which means using and wasting less

Reclaimed water is clean, treated water that is recycled to be used again for outdoor irrigation

levels of fecal coliform bacteria allowed in different water sources



While it isn't cleaned to the same level as drinking water, Savannah's reclaimed water is 7x cleaner than the standards for where shellfish are harvested, 11x cleaner than the state standards for reclaimed water, and 100x cleaner than standards for swimming water
