LESSON COMMITMENT AGREEMENT

By signing this agreement, the parent of \_\_\_\_\_ is agreeing to the following terms.

1. Lessons are given weekly. Lesson Prices are \$40 half hour, \$45 for whole hour. Packages are optional.  
Lessons payments are due at the time of service via cash, Venmo, or Cash app.
2. Absolutely no open toed shoes are allowed past the barn gates for anyone.
3. Helmets are required no matter the age of the student.
4. If you cancel more than 3 times, you will be required on the third time to pay for that lesson and resign a commitment contract.
5. No outside dogs/cats are allowed on the property.
6. Please park in the front and do not pull past the playground unless you are trailering. This is for the safety of our small children and animals.
7. No smoking on the property.
8. This lesson contract is a commitment to follow the rules, understand our coaches here are the instructors and the coaches. We want a committed team in this program and all our rules are to allow us to safely teach your children the correct way to ride. Horsemanship will always come before barrels or speed events in this program. Your child will learn everything from safety, tacking up properly, turning out, horsemanship & speed events if they desire.
9. This is not a program where we believe in constantly running the patterns over and over. In our professional opinion, this is not good for the horses mind, body & soul nor does it really ever help the rider like believe.
10. Camps are more for Fun Fun. Lessons are for learning. Clinics are for serious jockeys.
11. We do have a small portion of our program dedicated to basic learning, riding outside of the arena, fun & Therapy. These spots are limited because most of our lessons are geared toward performance speed events at some point.
12. If you are planning to compete, once your child reaches that level, it is best they have their own horses. LB Quarter Horses does not lease out our own horses competing.
13. It is highly suggested if your child wants to compete, they take lessons on the horse they want to compete on. Yes, this does mean, you will need to trailer your horse in for lessons if you are looking for real growth geared toward competing.
14. A signed riding waiver must be filled out and brought in to ride.
