

School Preparedness Plan to Meet County Guidance for COVID-19

Visitor Information

(POST ON WEBSITE AND AT ALL SCHOOL ENTRANCES)

VISITORS/VOLUNTEERS

The school allows only necessary visitors and volunteers on the campus and will limit the number of students and staff who come into contact with them.

FACE COVERINGS - We will support students and staff wearing masks by:

requiring that all students (kindergarten through 8th grade) to wear cloth face coverings in the classroom, while arriving and departing from school campus, and in any area outside of the classroom (except when eating, drinking, or engaging in physical activity). We will require all adults to wear a cloth face covering at all times while on campus, except while eating or drinking.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING - We will support physical distancing by:

having procedures for Arrival/Dismissal, Restrooms, Recess, Lunch, Hallways/walkways, Classrooms, Front Office, and Non-Classroom Settings. Students in grades K-4 will remain with the same cohort of students in the same space and staff rotation between cohorts will be limited. Students and staff will remain six feet apart to all extents practicable. Students in grades 5-8 will maintain a six-foot physical distance. Staff will remain six feet from volunteers or visitors. Parent and visitor access to the campus will be limited.

CLEANING & MAINTENANCE

We will support cleaning and maintenance of our campus by:

following the schedule outlined in our reopening plan for our classrooms, shared equipment/resources, shared spaces, front office, high touch surfaces, and restrooms.

HYGIENE - We will support routine and frequent handwashing by:

explicitly instructing how to wash hands, cough, and avoid touching one's eyes, nose, and mouth will be given at the start of the on-campus period and whenever students are added to the on-campus model. Hand sanitizer and disinfectant are available in every classroom and office.

ROUTINE TESTING - We will encourage and support staff testing by:

requiring all school staff who have contact with students or other staff to participate in surveillance testing on a monthly basis.

- Families are required to report known cases of COVID-19 in their household to the school immediately. The school will report all known COVID-19 cases to Santa Clara Public Health.
