**Scammer sketches for \$10K**

CRIME is finally paying off for socialite scammer **Anna Delvey**, who has a potential new career as an artist — pricing her sketches at \$10,000 apiece.  
Following interest in a "Free Anna Delvey" group art show last week on the Lower East Side — which included five of Delvey's drawings — we're told the onetime art-world grifter is working on a debut solo show.  
**Chris Martine**, who is handling art sales for Delvey, tells us, "The solo show will be more guest list focused with a celebrity clientele, as opposed to the grittier group show."  
Martine said the pieces by Delvey — the nom de guerre of **Anna Sorokin** — will be

made with prison-approved materials from the ICE detention center she's being held in. "We were able to get in paper that is 9 by 12 inches," he specified.  
While plans are still being finalized, Martine said he's hoping to have 20 works by next week for an April show. He added: "If you look at her sketches, she has legitimate talent."  
We're told that since Delvey sold the rights to her story to Netflix for the series "Inventing Anna" for \$320,000, the sketches are a way for her to be able to continue telling her story.  
Delvey's pieces in last week's group show have a meta layer of scam. Her pencil-on-paper drawings weren't the ones hanging on the

walls because "Anna could not get larger format paper into the prison; they denied it," Martine said. Plus, "we couldn't get any of the originals out" in time for the show, so they turned to **Alfredo Martinez** — a fellow artist and fraudster who spent time in prison in the early 2000s for forging works by **Jean-Michel Basquiat**. Martinez redrew Delvey's works as larger pieces and colored them in.  
One of their collaborative sketches features Delvey lying on a couch reading this newspaper with her on the cover. Words hover above her: "New York Post sentenced me to 15 years, turned me into a lesbian, married me off, and then deported me. Rude. Love them."

**Bynes becomes unbound**

**AMANDA Bynes** is free. A Superior Court of California judge in Ventura County ruled yesterday that the former child star's conservatorship could be terminated. Bynes filed a petition last month to end her conservatorship of nearly nine years. It was established in 2013 after she was hospitalized on an involuntary psychiatric hold. The \$150 hospital stay came after she allegedly started a small fire on an elderly woman's driveway. Her attorney, **David A. Esquibias**, said her condition had "improved" since then and that the court's intervention was "no longer necessary." Esquibias also said the "All That" and "Amanda Show" star has made "significant progress" in living with her bipolar disorder. He noted that Bynes is now sober after being in and out of rehab for several years. Her mother, **Lynn Bynes**, had served as Amanda's conservator — she and Amanda's father, **Rick Bynes**, supported the star's request to dissolve the conservatorship. Bynes, 35, said in a statement, "In the last several years, I have been working hard to improve my health so that I can live and work independently, and I will continue to prioritize my well being in this next chapter."
