2)	Review/Demonstrate	Stryker Cot	
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Make sure entire staff practices the following:

- Remove and load the gurney.
- Change the battery
- Position Trendelenburg
- Position elevated knee
- Shorten cot for short hallways
- Attach Neo-Mate and Pedi-Mate

3)	Review/Demonstrate	LifePak 15	
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Make sure entire staff practices the following:

- Discuss appropriate inventory level
- Remove and change battery
- Setup a patient with BP, SPO2, ETCO2, 4LD EKG and 12LD EKG (**Use one set of stickers and ETCO2 for practice**).
- Time stamp an intervention
- Sync vitals to tablet
- Decon Process
- Storage

4)	Review/Demonstrate	Vacuum Mattress	
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As a group practice and share responsibility roles:

- Secure patient on vacuum mattress with cervical collar
- Secure patient on vacuum mattress without cervical collar
- Place blanket on vacuum mattress prior to placing patient (aides in moving victim later).
- Practice different positions, left lateral, knees bent.
- Simulate vomiting, and roll patient.
- Decon Process
- Storage (with blanket)

5)	Review/Demonstrate	Vacuum Splints	
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As a group practice and share responsibility roles:

- Secure patient with knee injury
- Secure patient with shoulder injury
- Secure patient with elbow injury
- Decon Process
- Storage

6)	Log	Training
