

Our 2025 program brings back two books by Erik Kirschbaum, *Rocking the Wall*, about the famed concert Bruce Springsteen gave in 1988 in East Berlin, and *Burning Beethoven*, a out the anti-German hysteria that rocked America during World War I.

A new book also relating to that topic is Alfred Kerr's travel-log *New York and London*. In 1922 Kerr, the most famous theater critic of his time, visits the U.S. and Great Britain to plead for sympathy and protection for the fragile Weimar Republic. The book, translated by Professor Alan Bance of Southampton University will come out in fall 2025 for the first time in America.

Also recommended: *Our West Berlin*, a story collection from the time when the Wall was built

until the year when it came down in 1989. Two dozen authors—among them four Americans—remember when Kennedy came to town, when the Kurfürstendamm was lined with protesters against the Vietnam War, and how David Bowie found a trans girlfriend. With many black-and-white pictures from the era.

We publish other Weimar writers as well, among them Ernst Toller and — hopefully soon — Roda Roda, and most notably Kurt Tucholsky. We also offer Harold Poor's biography of the famed satirist: Kurt Tucholsky: The Short Fat Berliner Who Tried to Stop a Catastrophe With A Typewriter.








NEW YORK AND LONDON. Berlin theater critic Alfred Kerr travels to the USA and Great Britain in 1922. He visits Broadway and Wall Street, marvels at Times Square and Grand Central Station, rides the subway and calls New York the "greatest city in the world". He talks to the satirist Henry Louis Mencken, the railroad magnate W. Averell Harriman, Adolph Ochs, the publisher of The New York Times and — in London to the poet George Bernard Shaw. But his journey is more than a travellog: After World War I, when the mood in America and England was hostile towards Germany, Kerr is on a mission to ask for understanding and help for the fragile Weimar democracy.


Alfred Kerr

ALFRED KERR, born in Breslau in 1867, was a German-Jewish journalist. He wrote for Berliner Tageblatt and Frankfurter Zeitung and co-founded the art magazine Pan. Kerr, known for his ironic, film-like style was the most influential theater critics of his time. He wrote books on drama, travel stories from Corsica and Algeria, In 1933, after the book burning, he fled to Prague and then to London. He died in 1948 during a lecture tour in Hamburg.



ERNST TOLLER, born in 1893 to a Jewish family, was a revolutionary and playwright engagé, President for six days of the shortlived Bavarian Soviet Republic, as renowned as Brecht. High profile persona non grata when the Nazis came to power, he fled to the USA. He took his own life in New York City on May 22, 1939.




ROCKING THE WALL tells how the epic Bruce Springsteen concert in East Berlin in 1988, changed the world. For this book, Erik Kirschbaum spoke to scores of fans, concert goers, and organizers, unearthed newspaper clippings, TV footage, audio recordings, and even Stasi files. This book takes you to a journey with Bruce Springsteen and the E Street Band through East Berlin to the open air concert grounds at Weissensee where The Boss, live on stage, delivered a speech against the Wall to crowd of more than 300,000 delirious young East Germans. And they really wanted their Rock'n' Roll.






Harold Poor

HAROLD LLOYD POOR

was born in Missouri in 1935 and grew up in Alabama. He attended Harvard and earned a Ph.D. in German and European history at Columbia University. In 1966, he joined the Rutgers History Department where he was regarded as one of the most charismatic teachers. He produced a musical with texts by Tucholsky and 1935 about gay history. 1992, he died in New York City of AIDS.

BERLIN! BERLIN! is a satirical selection from the man with the acid pen and the perfect pitch, who was the voice of the 1920s. 

Kurt Tucholsky

KURT TUCHOLSKY, born in Berlin in 1890, was an influential journalist with five pen names for *Die Weltbühne*, the *Vorwärts* and the *Berliner Tageblatt*. He also wrote two novels. His contemporary Erich Kaestner called the liberal who fought the Nazis early on a "small, fat Berliner," who "tried to stop a catastrophe with his typewriter". Ultimately, he committed suicide in 1935 in Swedish exile.

Tucholsky, who was at the center of the tumultuous political and cultural world of 1920s Berlin still emerges as an astoniashingly contemporary journalist. BERLIN 1945: The Soviet army has conquered Berlin, a city reduced to rubble, and under martial law. You can learn how to make those jelly donuts known as "Berliners". Berlin cuisine is simple and down-to-earth. This cookbook also tells stories about the heritage of Berlin food: how Eisbein got its name — from an ice skating incident —, how Friedrich the Great made Prussian farmers plant potatoes, how meatballs were imported by French Huguenots who fled to Berlin in the 1700s, and how the German Chancellor Otto von Bismarck got his very own herring.

Twain also began a novel about Princess Wilhelmina von Preussen. His Berlin stories are assembled here for the first time, along with a riveting account of Twain's foray in the German capital, by Andreas Austilat.





Johann Sebastian Bach composed his cantatas in the St. Thomas Church; Martin Luther disputed the Pope; and Johann Wolfgang von Goethe's "Faust" got into a brawl at Auerbach's Keller. Leipzig, the site of one of the world's oldest and largest book fairs, is located at the crossroads of two historic roads from Paris to Moscow, from Rome to the Baltic Sea. Here, Richard Wagner was born, Clara met Franz Schumann, Felix Mendelssohn made music, Erich Kästner drank coffee, and Kurt Masur directed. Leipzig rallies at the St. Nicholas Church led to the downfall of Communism. Since then, the city has been splendidly rebuilt.



THE RED ORCHESTRA was a Berlinbased resistance group that fought against the Nazis within Germany. The Gestapo labeled them Communists and traitors, and so did the Western Allies. But they held a variety of political beliefs, operating independently, with at least 400 members, including a few American expats.
