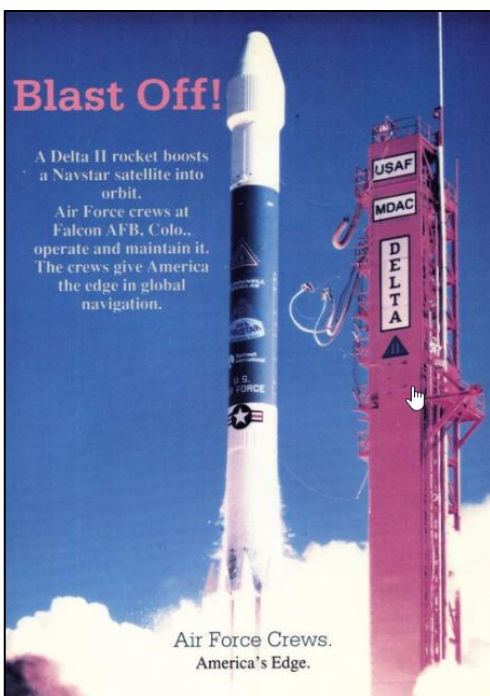
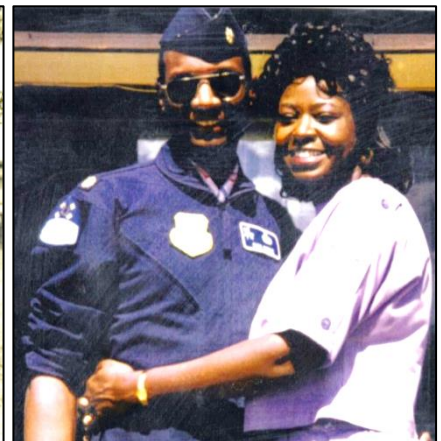

Retired in 1997.



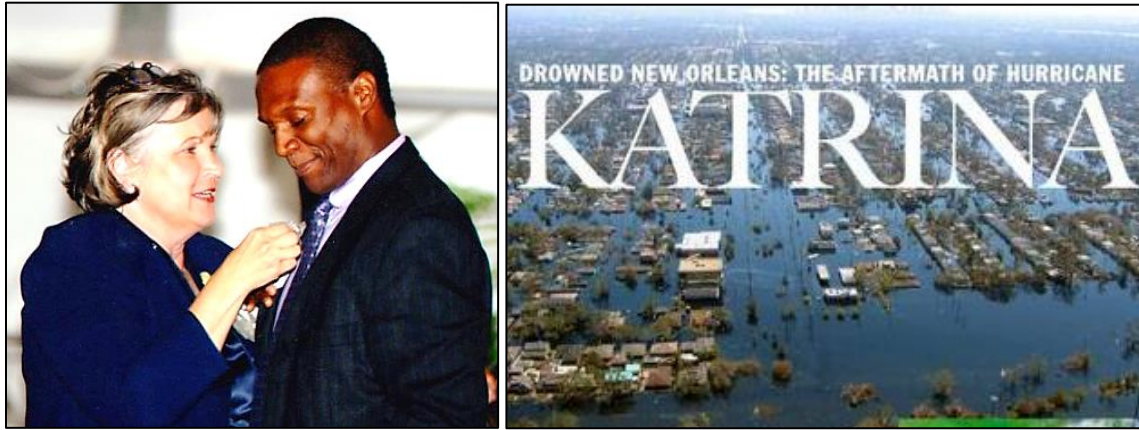
**FIRST GPS II

The program launched a total of 62 GPS II satellites.

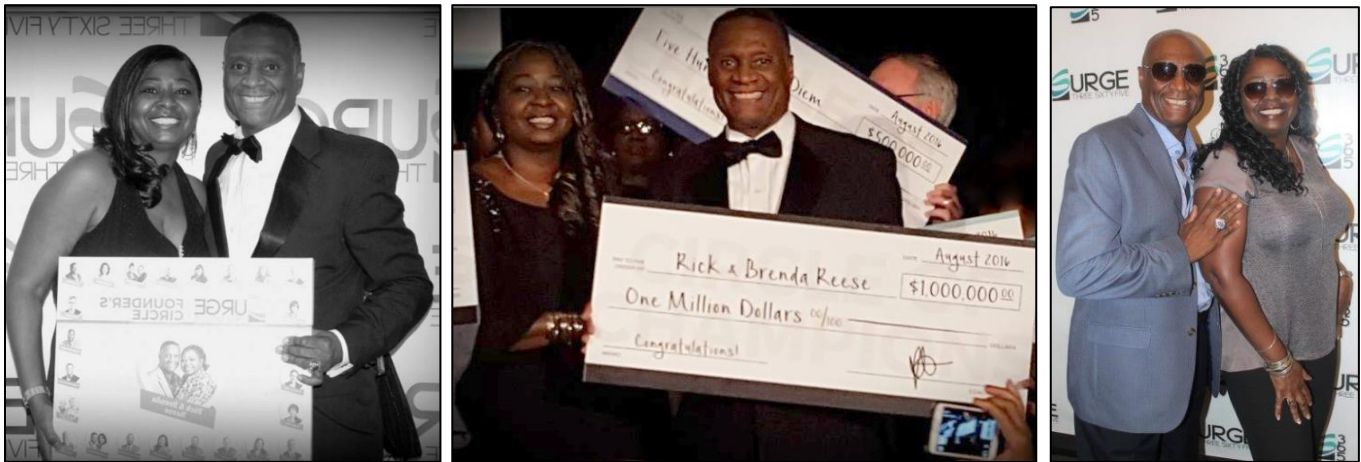
Much of the world now takes for granted GPS for accurate location and navigation services.

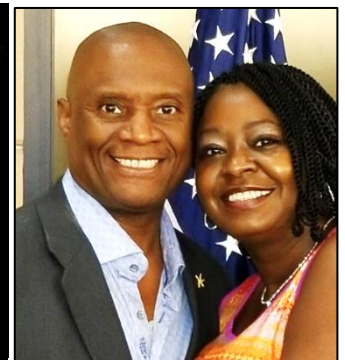
